Bill Summary

The measure requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to conduct a records search of the Oklahoma State Courts Network (OSCN) for all employees of a child care facility and for persons 18 years of age or older residing in a facility prior to issuing a permit or license to a person making application to operate a facility.

Further, the bill requires a child care facility to submit a request to DHS to conduct a search of OSCN before employing a person to work in the facility or allowing a person 18 years of age or older to reside in the facility and deletes the requirement that the records search had to be completed by DHS before a facility could hire an employee or allow an adult to move into the facility.

HB 1742 amends the Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act to clean-up outdated language and change procedures for conducting criminal background reviews.

Fiscal Analysis

This is a request bill from the Department of Human Services (DHS). This bill clarifies language in existing Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act. *According to DHS, the changes are revenue neutral, so the fiscal impact of the measure is zero (\$0).*
