HB1845 expands the crime of bribery to include consideration for contracts, construction agreements, right-of-way acquisition and competitive bidding.

HB 1845, as introduced, expands the crime of bribery of a public official to include contracts, construction agreements, right-of-way acquisitions and competitive bids. The measure also expands the definition of “racketeering activity” to include activity relating to any violation of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974.
