Bill Summary

The proposed committee substitute modifies fines for trespassing on farming, ranching, or forestry land. The current fine is limited to \$250. The PCS sets a minimum of \$250 and a maximum of \$500. Second or subsequent offenses shall be fined between \$750 and \$1,000. The measure also provides a minimum fine of \$250 and a maximum of \$500 for trespassing on a commercial hunting area. The current fine is a maximum of \$250.

Fiscal Summary

The proposed committee substitute for HB 1873 increases the fine for persons found guilty of trespass on land devoted to farming, ranching, or forestry purposes, a licensed commercial hunting area, or a facility licensed pursuant to the Oklahoma Farmed Cervidae Act.
