Bill Summary

The proposed committee substitute to House Bill 2753 removes the requirement that the State Board of Education determine whether a new charter school exceeds the limit on establishing more than three charter schools per year in each county having more than 500,000 in population. It also removes the requirement that the board not fund any schools that are over that limit.

The bill also allows any school district to establish a charter school. It allows technology center school districts to establish charter schools as long as the charter is in a school district served by the technology center school district.

The bill also removes the 5,000 average daily membership and 500,000 county population requirements for comprehensive and regional institutions to establish charter schools in school districts.

The bill removes the restriction of not establishing more than three charter schools in each county with more than 500,000 population per fiscal year.

The Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 2753 contains provisions relating to Oklahoma Charter Schools, including deleting sponsors' size restrictions and eliminating the limit on the number of new schools that can be sponsored annually.
