**Bill Summary**

The Proposed Subcommittee Substitute to House Bill 2757 directs the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to design and implement a voluntary program for both public and private marinas to help keep the state's waterways clean. Marinas that meet the environmental standards and requirements established by DEQ are to be certified as a "Clean Oklahoma Marina." In addition, the measure directs DEQ to provide assistance, training and outreach to marinas regarding recycling, environmental purchasing, conservation and pollution prevention.

**Fiscal Summary**

The proposed committee substitute for HB 2757 directs the Department of Environmental Quality to design a voluntary environmental program for marinas, allowing certain marinas to qualify to be called Clean Oklahoma Marina. It directs the Department to provide assistance, training and outreach.

**Fiscal Analysis**

Officials at the Department of Environmental Quality state that the provisions of the measure direct them to administer the certification program, and to provide assistance, training and outreach to interested marinas. Based on previous voluntary programs of this nature, the Department estimates that .5 to 1 FTE would be necessary, at a cost of \$40,000 - \$75,000 per year.
