15 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause and
entire bill and insert

17 "An Act relating to counties and county officers;
amending 19 O.S. 2001, Section 180.75, as amended by
18 Section 2, Chapter 362, O.S.L. 2010 (19 O.S. Supp.
2010, Section 180.75), which relates to salaries and
19 compensation; making certain salary increases
discretionary; providing for codification; and
providing an effective date.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2001, Section 180.75, as
23 amended by Section 2, Chapter 362, O.S.L. 2010 (19 O.S. Supp. 2010,
24 Section 180.75), is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 180.75 A. In every county in this state which approves
2 an exemption of household goods of the heads of families and
3 livestock employed in support of the family from ad valorem taxation
4 pursuant to the provisions of Section 6 of Article X of the Oklahoma
5 Constitution, the salary of all county officers named in paragraph 1
6 of Section 180.73 of this title ~~shall~~ may be increased from the
7 applicable basic salary named in Section 180.74 of this title, for
8 the factor of service-ability, as defined in Section 180.71 of this
9 title, according to the following scale:

10 1. To the basic salary:

11 a. add the product of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) times
12 each Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) of revenue
13 authorized to be collected for county purposes, or
14 major fraction thereof until the amount of such
15 revenue equals Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
16 (\$750,000.00),

17 b. thereafter add the product of One Hundred Dollars
18 (\$100.00) times each additional Fifty Thousand Dollars
19 (\$50,000.00) of revenue authorized to be collected for
20 county purposes, or major fraction thereof until the
21 amount of such revenue equals Five Million Dollars
22 (\$5,000,000.00),

23 c. thereafter add the product of One Hundred Twenty-five
24 Dollars (\$125.00) times each additional Seventy

1 Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) of revenue authorized to
2 be collected for county purposes, or major fraction
3 thereof until the amount of such revenue equals Twenty
4 Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00),

- 5 d. thereafter as to all additional revenue which is
6 authorized to be collected for county purposes add the
7 product of One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00)
8 times each additional Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
9 (\$200,000.00) of such revenue, or major fraction
10 thereof; and

11 2. The salary of each county officer shall be additionally
12 increased from the basic salary named in Section 180.74 of this
13 title, and the additions to the basic salary as provided in this
14 section, for population or service load according to the following
15 scale:

- 16 a. the product of Twelve Dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)
17 times each one thousand (1,000) population, or major
18 fraction thereof until a population of seventy-five
19 thousand (75,000) is reached,
20 b. thereafter the product of Twelve Dollars and fifty
21 cents (\$12.50) times each additional five thousand
22 (5,000) population, or major fraction thereof until a
23 population of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) is
24 reached,

1 c. thereafter add the product of Twelve Dollars and fifty
2 cents (\$12.50) times each additional ten thousand
3 (10,000) population, or major fraction thereof.

4 B. This section shall not reduce the present salary of any
5 county officer in Oklahoma during their present term of office.

6 C. As used in this section, "major fraction thereof" means any
7 amount greater than one-half (1/2).

8 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 339.7 of Title 19, unless there
10 is created a duplication of numbering, reads as follows:

11 A. The board of county commissioners of any county of this
12 state having a population of more than two hundred twenty-five
13 thousand (225,000) persons according to the last federal decennial
14 census may by resolution authorize the expenditure of monies
15 deposited in the county highway fund created by Section 1503 of
16 Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the enhancement of any public
17 property located within the boundaries of the county in accordance
18 with subsection C of this section.

19 B. The authorization for the use of monies in the county
20 highway fund as set forth in subsection A of this section is
21 intended to be cumulative of, and in addition to, any other lawful
22 use of such monies that is already authorized by the Oklahoma
23 Statutes. The State Legislature specifically finds that the use of
24 county highway fund monies for the purposes set forth in this

1 section will serve to promote the health, safety, and welfare of the
2 residents of the county.

3 C. In carrying out the enhancement of any public property
4 pursuant to this section, the board of county commissioners shall
5 utilize persons sentenced to community service, with the county
6 highway fund monies to be expended solely to provide supervisors for
7 community service workers and to provide for any equipment,
8 materials, and supplies necessary or appropriate for the enhancement
9 of the public property.

10 D. For the purposes of this section:

11 1. "Enhancement of any public property" means any action or
12 project by the county or its agents that serves to improve the
13 appearance, safety, or utility of any public property located within
14 the boundaries of the county by the accomplishment of any one or
15 more of the following actions or projects:

- 16 a. trash, debris, and litter removal from any public
17 property,
- 18 b. tire removal from any public property,
- 19 c. the clearing of overgrown vegetation from any public
20 property,
- 21 d. the clean-up of any public park,
- 22 e. the removal of graffiti from any public property, and
- 23 f. the clearing of public drainage easements; and

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
