13 Hospital Residency Training Program Act - provide
14 certain funding - reporting mechanisms - advisory
board - effective date - emergency]

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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
22 Hospital Residency Training Program Act".
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1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

5 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new
6 residency training programs under the rules established by the
7 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities
8 authorized to establish residency training programs;

9 2. "Residency training program" means post medical school
10 graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and
11 Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies
12 of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training
13 disciplines of family medicine, general internal medicine, general
14 pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology and emergency medicine; and

15 3. "Medical education costs" means those expenses necessary to
16 expand the entering class size of the medical schools at the
17 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the
18 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of
19 Community Medicine.

20 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
2 Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower
3 Training Commission.

4 B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
5 Program shall be to establish new residency training programs
6 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
7 Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU
8 School of Community Medicine in eligible hospitals, and to expand
9 the number of physicians graduating from medical schools at the
10 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the
11 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of
12 Community Medicine, focused on meeting the healthcare needs of rural
13 and urban underserved populations, subject to the availability of
14 funding.

15 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in
19 consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of
20 Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine
21 and the OU School of Community Medicine, designate hospitals for the
22 creation of new residency training programs.

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1 B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by
2 contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the
3 establishment of new residency training programs.

4 C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state-
5 appropriated entities are authorized to contract with eligible
6 hospitals to provide funding for the establishment of new residency
7 training programs affiliated with the Oklahoma State University
8 College of Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma
9 School of Community Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College
10 of Medicine.

11 D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the
12 assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
13 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma School of Community Medicine
14 and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide
15 technical assistance and funding for the colleges' costs incurred in
16 supporting the programs to ensure that residency training programs
17 established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
18 Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare
19 Services.

20 E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish
21 reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of
22 progress of the new residency training programs.

23 F. The medical schools at the Oklahoma State University College
24 of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of

1 Medicine and the OU School of Community Medicine shall, subject to
2 available funding, increase the entering class size and number of
3 graduating physicians to provide a sufficient number of Oklahoma
4 residents to fill the residencies created by the Oklahoma Hospital
5 Residency Training Program Act for the purposes of providing health
6 care services to the rural and urban underserved populations of
7 Oklahoma. For purposes of the funding provided by the Oklahoma
8 Hospital Residency Training Program Act, the school year 2009-2010
9 shall be the base year against which class size increases are to be
10 determined.

11 G. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state-
12 appropriated entities are authorized to contract with the medical
13 schools at the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
14 Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU
15 School of Community Medicine to provide funding for medical
16 education costs for the expansion of the entering class size and
17 increase in the number of graduating physicians serving rural and
18 urban underserved populations in Oklahoma.

19 H. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state
20 appropriated entities providing funding shall ensure that the
21 allocation of funding is prioritized to accomplish the creation of
22 new residency training programs prior to funds being allocated for
23 medical education costs.

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1 I. The Physician Manpower Training Commission and other state-
2 appropriated entities receiving state appropriated funds pursuant to
3 the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act shall
4 collaborate with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, or other
5 federally designated entities, to acquire federal matching funds to
6 further the pursuance of the provisions of the Oklahoma Hospital
7 Residency Training Program Act. The transfer of funds between state
8 appropriated entities pursuant to this provision are hereby
9 authorized.

10 J. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a
11 report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
12 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
13 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month
14 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which
15 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the
16 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
17 Training Program Act.

18 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a
22 residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of
23 eligible hospitals and to prioritize the funding needs of eligible
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1 hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
2 Program Act.

3 B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the
4 Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
5 Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of
6 Medicine, the Dean of the OU School of Community Medicine, the
7 Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for Rural Health, a
8 representative from a statewide association of community-based
9 health care providers, and a representative from a statewide
10 association of hospitals.

11 C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a
12 recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.

13 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund
17 for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the
18 "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". The
19 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
20 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the
21 Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal
22 funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to
23 or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies
24 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may

1 be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training
2 Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital
3 Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be
4 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims
5 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for
6 approval and payment.

7 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

8 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
10 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
