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8 An Act relating to waters and water rights; creating  
9 the Water for 2060 Act; stating finding; declaring  
10 state policy; limiting application of the act;  
11 amending 82 O.S. 2011, Section 1088.1, which relates  
12 to the Oklahoma Water Conservation Grant Program Act;  
13 modifying title; adding entities eligible to be  
14 considered communities; expanding pilot projects;  
15 creating the Water for 2060 Advisory Council;  
16 establishing membership of the Advisory Council;  
17 providing for officers, meetings, quorum and  
18 vacancies; providing for staff support; listing  
19 duties and responsibilities of the Advisory Council;  
20 requiring the Advisory Council to submit a final  
21 report by a certain date; providing for  
22 recodification; and providing for codification.  
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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1088.11 of Title 82, unless  
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Water for 2060  
23 Act".  
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1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1088.12 of Title 82, unless  
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The Legislature hereby declares that, in order to protect  
5 Oklahoma citizens from increased water supply shortages and  
6 groundwater depletions by the year 2060 in most of the eighty-two  
7 watershed planning basins in the state as described in the 2012  
8 Update of the Oklahoma Comprehensive Water Plan, the public policy  
9 of this state is to establish and work toward a goal of consuming no  
10 more fresh water in the year 2060 than is consumed statewide in the  
11 year 2012, while continuing to grow the population and economy of  
12 the state and to achieve this goal through utilizing existing water  
13 supplies more efficiently and expanding the use of alternatives such  
14 as wastewater, brackish water, and other nonpotable supplies.  
15 Provided, however, that nothing in the Water for 2060 Act shall be  
16 construed as amending the provisions of law pertaining to rights or  
17 permits to use water.

18 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2011, Section 1088.1, is  
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 1088.1 A. ~~This section shall be known and may be cited~~  
21 ~~as~~ There is hereby created the "Oklahoma Water Conservation Grant  
22 Program Act".

23 B. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall solicit proposals  
24 for and make grants for the establishment of pilot programs which

1 will implement water conservation projects or plans in communities  
2 in the state.

3 C. The goals and objectives of the grant program are to:

4 1. Increase the awareness of the public through education  
5 programs or public information campaigns regarding the value of our  
6 water resources and how water can be used more efficiently;

7 2. Provide assistance to communities or entities initiating  
8 water conservation plans, programs, and activities and to research  
9 and document the potential for improving water use efficiency  
10 through demonstration projects and other activities; and

11 3. Assist in the development of policies which will encourage  
12 the implementation of water conservation measures.

13 D. For purposes of this section, communities may include entire  
14 cities or towns, combined cities or towns, parts of cities or towns,  
15 or schools, groups or entities located within a community, or one or  
16 more rural water districts or portions of water districts.

17 E. Contingent upon the availability of funding, the Board may  
18 award grants each year in an amount not to exceed Twenty-five  
19 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for each grant. The total amount of  
20 grants awarded each year shall not exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars  
21 (\$50,000.00).

22 F. The pilot projects shall be innovative programs that will  
23 serve as models for other communities in the state. Pilot projects  
24 may include, but are not limited to, community conservation

1 demonstration projects, water use accounting programs, retrofit  
2 projects, school education projects, Xeriscape demonstration  
3 gardens, projects which promote efficiency, recycling and reuse of  
4 water, and information campaigns on capturing and using harvested  
5 rainwater and graywater.

6 G. The Board shall determine pilot project criteria and  
7 establish a process for the consideration of proposals. The  
8 proposals for pilot projects shall be considered on a statewide  
9 competitive basis. The Board shall promulgate rules for the  
10 operation of the projects.

11 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1088.14 of Title 82, unless  
13 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 A. There is hereby created an advisory council to be known as  
15 the "Water for 2060 Advisory Council".

16 B. The Advisory Council shall consist of fifteen (15) members  
17 as follows:

18 1. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Water Resources  
19 Board;

20 2. Four members appointed by the Governor who shall be well  
21 versed in municipal, rural residential, and agriculture water uses,  
22 as well as water-efficiency practices and technologies;

23 3. Five members, with one member being from each of the  
24 congressional districts, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma

1 House of Representatives who shall be well versed in recreation,  
2 industrial, and irrigation water uses, as well as water and  
3 wastewater reuse practices and technologies; and

4 4. Five members, with one member being from each of the  
5 congressional districts, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of  
6 the Oklahoma State Senate who shall be well versed in soil  
7 conservation, small business, and environmental water interests, as  
8 well as marginal quality and brackish water use practices and  
9 technologies.

10 C. Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of their  
11 respective appointing authority.

12 D. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Water Resources Board  
13 shall serve as chair of the Advisory Council, with other officers  
14 selected by the Advisory Council as it deems necessary. Meetings of  
15 the Advisory Council shall be held at the call of the chair. A  
16 majority of the members of the Advisory Council shall constitute a  
17 quorum to transact business, but no vacancy shall impair the right  
18 of the remaining members to exercise all of the powers of the  
19 Advisory Council. A vacancy on the Advisory Council shall be filled  
20 by the original appointing authority. Staff support for the  
21 Advisory Council shall be provided by the staff of the Oklahoma  
22 Water Resources Board. Other state agencies shall provide support  
23 and information as requested by the Advisory Council.

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1 E. The Advisory Council shall have the following duties and  
2 responsibilities:

3 1. Recommend incentives to encourage improved irrigation and  
4 farming techniques, more efficient infrastructure, use of water  
5 recycling/reuse systems, promotion of "smart" irrigation techniques,  
6 control of invasive species, artificial recharge of aquifers, and  
7 increased use of marginal quality and brackish waters;

8 2. Make recommendations regarding the expansion of education  
9 programs that modify and improve consumer water-use habits;

10 3. Enhance existing, or develop new, financial assistance  
11 programs that encourage Oklahoma water systems to implement leak  
12 detection and repair programs that result in reduced loss and waste  
13 of water, as well as encourage consolidation and regionalization of  
14 smaller systems in order to utilize limited resources most  
15 efficiently; and

16 4. Any other responsibilities consistent with the Water for  
17 2060 Act.

18 F. The Advisory Council shall submit a final report of its  
19 findings and recommendations to the Governor, Speaker of the House  
20 of Representatives, and President Pro Tempore of the Senate no later  
21 than the date which is three (3) years following the date this act  
22 becomes effective.

23 SECTION 5. RECODIFICATION 82 O.S. 2011, Section 1088.1,  
24 as amended by Section 3 of this act, shall be recodified as Section
