7 An Act relating to memorial highway designations;
8 designating the U.S. Border Patrol Chief Donald R.
9 Coppock Memorial Highway; designating the Coach Ray
10 Troutt Memorial Highway; designating the Senator
11 David Myers Memorial Highway; designating the Veldo
12 M. Goins Memorial Bridge; designating the Paul Harvey
13 Memorial Expressway; designating the Representative
14 Rusty Farley Memorial Highway; designating the Wesley
15 and Maxine Nixon Bridge; designating the Charles
16 Davis Memorial Highway; designating the Dr. James E.
17 and Representative Mina Hibdon Memorial Highway;
18 designating the Bill W. Burgess Jr. Highway;
19 designating the Major Brice Clayton Coleman Memorial
20 Highway; designating the Senator Ralph J. Choate
21 Memorial Highway; designating the Trooper William
22 McClendon Memorial Highway; designating the Jimmy
23 Harrel Highway; designating the Deputy Mike Roberts
24 and Deputy Tim Lowry Memorial Highway; providing for
placement of suitable permanent markers; providing
for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.112 of Title 69, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The portion of State Highway 11 from the junction of State
Highway 11 and U.S. Highway 64 extending east to the junction of

1 State Highway 11 and State Highway 38 shall be designated as the
2 "U.S. Border Patrol Chief Donald R. Coppock Memorial Highway".
3 Pursuant to the provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the
4 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers
5 to be placed upon the highway bearing that name.

6 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.113 of Title 69, unless
8 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 The portion of State Highway 58 from the junction of State
10 Highway 58 and State Highway 45 extending north to the junction of
11 State Highway 58 and U.S. Highway 64 shall be designated as the
12 "Coach Ray Troutt Memorial Highway". Pursuant to the provisions of
13 Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of Transportation
14 shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway
15 bearing that name.

16 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.114 of Title 69, unless
18 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 The portion of State Highway 11 from the junction of State
20 Highway 11 and U.S. Highway 77 extending east to Kaw City, Oklahoma,
21 shall be designated as the "Senator David Myers Memorial Highway".
22 Pursuant to the provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the
23 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers
24 to be placed upon the highway bearing that name.

1 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.115 of Title 69, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The bridge crossing Grand Lake on U.S. Highway 59 in Delaware
5 County between Copeland, Oklahoma, and Grove, Oklahoma, shall be
6 designated as the "Veldo M. Goins Memorial Bridge". The Department
7 of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be
8 placed at the north and south ends of the bridge.

9 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.116 of Title 69, unless
11 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 The portion of U.S. Highway 75 from the junction of U.S. Highway
13 75 and U.S. Highway 412 extending south to the junction of U.S.
14 Highway 75 and U.S. Highway 64 shall be designated as the "Paul
15 Harvey Memorial Expressway". Pursuant to the provisions of Title 69
16 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of Transportation shall
17 cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway
18 bearing that name.

19 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.117 of Title 69, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 The portion of U.S. Highway 70 from Broken Bow, Oklahoma,
23 extending south to Idabel, Oklahoma, shall be designated as the
24 "Representative Rusty Farley Memorial Highway". Pursuant to the

1 provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of
2 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed
3 upon the highway bearing that name.

4 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.118 of Title 69, unless
6 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 The bridge crossing State Highway 50 north of Freedom, Oklahoma,
8 near the intersection of State Highway 50 and U.S. Highway 64 shall
9 be designated as the "Wesley and Maxine Nixon Bridge". The
10 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers
11 to be placed at the north and south ends of the bridge.

12 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.119 of Title 69, unless
14 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 The portion of State Highway 125 from the junction of State
16 Highway 125 and State Highway 85A extending south to where State
17 Highway 125 terminates on Monkey Island shall be designated as the
18 "Charles Davis Memorial Highway". Pursuant to the provisions of
19 Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of Transportation
20 shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway
21 bearing that name.

22 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.120 of Title 69, unless
24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 The portion of Interstate 35 from the junction of Interstate 35
2 and Indian Hills Road extending south to junction of Interstate 35
3 and State Highway 9 West shall be designated as the "Dr. James E.
4 and Representative Mina M. Hibdon Memorial Highway". Pursuant to
5 the provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department
6 of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be
7 placed upon the highway bearing that name.

8 SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.121 of Title 69, unless
10 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

11 The portion of Interstate 44 from the point one (1) mile north
12 of the intersection of Interstate 44 and U.S. Highway 62 extending
13 south to the intersection of Interstate 44 and State Highway 7 shall
14 be designated as the "Bill W. Burgess Jr. Highway". Pursuant to the
15 provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of
16 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed
17 upon the highway bearing that name.

18 SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.122 of Title 69, unless
20 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 The portion of State Highway 48 in Creek County from the
22 junction of State Highway 48 and West 251st Street South extending
23 south to the junction of State Highway 48 and East 950 Road shall be
24 designated as the "Major Brice Clayton Coleman Memorial Highway".

1 Pursuant to the provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the
2 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers
3 to be placed upon the highway bearing that name.

4 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.123 of Title 69, unless
6 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 The portion of United States Highway 81 located within the
8 municipal limits of the City of Hennessey shall be designated as
9 "Senator Ralph J. Choate Memorial Highway". Pursuant to the
10 provisions of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of
11 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed
12 on the highway bearing that name.

13 SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.124 of Title 69, unless
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 The portion of U.S. Highway 75 beginning at the junction of U.S.
17 Highway 75 and West 201st Street South extending south to Okmulgee,
18 Oklahoma, shall be designated as the "Trooper William McClendon
19 Memorial Highway". Pursuant to the provisions of Title 69 of the
20 Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of Transportation shall cause
21 suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway bearing
22 that name.

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1 SECTION 14. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.125 of Title 69, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The portion of State Highway 34 from the Dewey County and Custer
5 County line extending northward to the Canadian River shall be
6 designated as "Jimmy Harrel Highway". Pursuant to the provisions of
7 Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of Transportation
8 shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway
9 bearing that name.

10 SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.126 of Title 69, unless
12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 The portion of State Highway 39 extending from the municipal
14 limits of the city of Asher to the municipal limits of the city of
15 Konawa shall be designated as the "Deputy Mike Roberts and Deputy
16 Tim Lowry Memorial Highway". Pursuant to the provisions of Title 69
17 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Department of Transportation shall
18 cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway

19 SECTION 16. It being immediately necessary for the
20 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
21 hereby
22 declared to exist, by reason whereof this resolution shall take
23 effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
