8 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
9 2011, Section 150.6a, which relates to the annual
10 salaries of employees of the Oklahoma State Bureau of
11 Investigation; deleting obsolete language; deleting
12 reference to salary of the Director; authorizing the
13 Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of
14 Investigation to modify salaries of certain
15 employees; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2,
16 which relates to chief executive officer salaries;
17 and updating year.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, is
20 amended to read as follows:

2 criminalist job families may receive additional compensation through
3 the use of pay mechanisms provided for in the Oklahoma Personnel Act
4 and the Merit System of Personnel Administration Rules.

5 ~~C. Effective January 1, 2007~~ B. Beginning on the effective
6 date of this act, the annual salaries for the Deputy Director, and
7 the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, as
8 set out in this section, shall be in accordance and conformity with
9 the following salary schedule, exclusive of longevity pay as
10 authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

17 salary the employee received on December 31, 2006.

18 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 3601.2 A. Beginning January 1, ~~2010~~ 2013, the agency,
21 board, commission, department or program shall establish the salary
22 of each of the chief executive officers for which they have
23 appointing authority. Such salary shall be set between the minimum
24 and maximum of the range specified below, for full-time employees

1 only, per annum, payable monthly, pursuant to the limitations
2 outlined below:

3 1. If the chief executive officer's salary is below the minimum
4 annual salary then it ~~can not~~ cannot be raised to more than the
5 minimum annual salary in one (1) fiscal year. If the chief
6 executive officer's salary is at or above the minimum annual salary
7 then the salary may not be increased above the midpoint in one (1)
8 fiscal year;

9 2. Such increases shall not occur more than once in a fiscal
10 year; and

11 3. The salary of the incumbent chief executive officer shall
12 not be increased if the officer's salary exceeds the maximum of the
13 range.

1 B. All increases require certification of the appointing
2 authority that said action can be implemented for the current fiscal
3 year and subsequent fiscal year without the need for additional
4 funding. The agency, board, commission, department or program shall
5 report increases granted under this section to the Office of
6 Personnel Management on an annual basis by August 1 of each year.
7 The Office of Personnel management shall forward a report of such
8 increases to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and
9 Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than September 1 of
10 each year.

11 C. Every two (2) years starting FY-05, the Office of Personnel
12 Management shall review these salary ranges and report on and make
13 recommendations on proposed salary ranges in their annual
14 compensation reports mandated by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of
15 this title by no later than December 1.

16 D. Every three (3) years the Legislature shall review the
17 salary ranges specified in subsection A of this section.

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
