6 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act;  
7 amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.26, which relates  
8 to reciprocal agreement authority; adding non-  
9 permitting carry states that Oklahoma shall  
10 reciprocate under certain circumstances; requiring  
11 compliance with the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act;  
12 requiring certain proof of residency; requiring the  
13 Department of Public Safety to maintain certain list  
14 of states; and providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.26, is  
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 1290.26.

19 RECIPROCAL AGREEMENT AUTHORITY

20 The State of Oklahoma hereby recognizes any valid concealed  
21 carry weapons permit or license issued by another state, or if the  
22 state is a nonpermitting carry state, this state shall reciprocate  
23 under the permitting law of that state.

24 A. Any person entering this state in possession of a firearm  
authorized for concealed carry upon the authority and license of  
another state is authorized to continue to carry a concealed firearm

1 and license in this state; provided the license from the other state  
2 remains valid. The firearm must be carried fully concealed from  
3 detection and view, and upon coming in contact with any peace  
4 officer of this state, the person must disclose the fact that he or  
5 she is in possession of a concealed firearm pursuant to a valid  
6 concealed carry weapons permit or license issued in another state.

7 B. Any person entering this state in possession of a firearm  
8 authorized for concealed carry upon the authority of a state that is  
9 a nonpermitted carry state and the person is in compliance with the  
10 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, the person is authorized to carry a  
11 concealed firearm in this state. The firearm must be carried fully  
12 concealed from detection and view, and upon coming in contact with  
13 any peace officer of this state, the person must disclose the fact  
14 that he or she is in possession of a concealed firearm pursuant to  
15 the nonpermitting laws of the state in which he or she is a legal  
16 resident. The person shall present proper identification by a valid  
17 photo ID as proof that he or she is a legal resident in such a non-  
18 permitting state. The Department of Public Safety shall keep a  
19 current list of non-permitting states for law enforcement officers  
20 to confirm that a state is nonpermitting.

21 C. Any person who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older  
22 having a valid firearm license from another state may apply for a  
23 concealed handgun license in this state immediately upon  
24 establishing a residence in this state.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2012.
