fought in timed rounds;

10 <u>5. 6.</u> "Applicant" means any individual, club, association, 11 corporation, partnership or trust which submits to the Oklahoma 12 State Athletic Commission an application for a license or permit 13 pursuant to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act;

14 <u>6.</u> <u>7.</u> "Booking agent" means independent contractors who act as 15 bookers, agents, agencies and representatives who secure engagements 16 and contracts for combative sports participants;

"Boxing" means any form of competitive pugilism or 18 unarmed combat in which a blow is usually struck which may 19 reasonably be expected to inflict injury, including, but not limited 20 to, boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts, and kickboxing, but shall 21 not include the martial arts as defined by the provisions of this 22 section;

"Broadcast" means any audio or visual transmission sent by any means of signal within, into, or from this state, whether 2 3 live or taped or time delayed, and includes any replays thereof; 9. 10. "Cable system operator" means any person who makes 4 5 available or provides customers a closed-circuit telecast which is pay-per-view, including any person who does so as a direct broadcast 6 satellite provider or other multichannel video service provider; 7 10. 11. "Closed-circuit telecast of professional combative 8 9 sporting events" means telecast rights, including television, cable 10 television, or pay-per-view telecasts, acquired by paying a 11 licensing fee or by paying a contractual price by a business or individual, including, but not limited to, arenas, entertainment or 12 13 meeting centers, restaurants, bars, taverns, hotels, motels, clubs, and organizations, which offers the viewing of the event to the 14 public or to private residences. Such events shall include local 15 16 and state professional boxing combative sports contests and professional exhibitions as defined in this section. For purposes 17 of Section 622 of this title, "closed-circuit telecast" means any 18 such telecast of a professional combative sporting event as 19 20 described herein which is not intended to be available for viewing without the payment of a fee, collected for or based upon each event 21 viewed, for the privilege of viewing the telecast, and includes pay-22 per-view; 23

1 <u>11. 12.</u> "Club" means an incorporated or unincorporated
2 association or body of individuals voluntarily united and acting
3 together for some common or special purpose;

4 <u>12. 13.</u> "Combative sports" means any form of competitive 5 pugilism or unarmed combat in which a blow is usually struck which 6 may reasonably be expected to inflict injury, including but not 7 limited to boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts, and kickboxing, 8 but shall not include the martial arts (singular) as defined by the 9 provisions of this section;

10 13. 14. "Combative sports practitioner" means a person who 11 competes or spars in a combative sports event and includes boxers, 12 kickboxers, mixed martial artists and wrestlers;

"Kickboxing" means any form of competitive pugilistic 6 professional contest or exhibition in which blows are delivered with 7 the hand and any part of the foot. Such contests or exhibitions 8 9 take place in a rope-enclosed ring and are fought in timed rounds; 10 19. 22. "License" means a certificate issued by the Commission 11 to participants of sanctioned professional combative sports 12 contests, professional exhibitions, and amateur mixed martial arts 13 contests and is a mandatory requirement for participation in such events; 14

20. 23. "Manager" means an individual who controls or 15 administers the affairs of any professional combative sports 16 participant, including acting as a booking agent. "Manager" shall 17 include the representative of a manager as defined by the 18 Commission:

12 <u>34.</u> "Promoter" means any individual, whether a resident or 13 nonresident of Oklahoma, or club or corporation, whether 14 domesticated or not domesticated in Oklahoma, that produces or 15 stages professional contests, amateur mixed martial arts contests, 16 or professional exhibitions conducted within this state and shall 17 include any officer, director, or employees as defined by the 18 Commission;

22 remuneration or thing of value for which a professional boxer

include the participant's share of any payment received for radio broadcasting, television, including cable television, pay-per-view television, and closed-circuit television, and motion picture rights. "Purse" shall also include gate receipts and any other prizes;

"Ring official" means any individual who performs an 7 official function during the progress of a professional boxing 8 contest, combative sports event or amateur mixed martial arts 9 contest, or professional exhibition event including but not limited 10 to timekeepers, judges, referees, and attending physicians;

11 34. 38. "Sanctioning permit" means a permit issued by the 12 Commission to promoters who make application for official approval 13 of professional boxing contests, <u>combative sports events and</u> amateur 14 mixed martial arts contests and professional exhibitions <u>events</u>;

15 <u>35.</u> <u>39.</u> "Sparring" means to engage in a form of boxing 16 <u>combative sport</u> with jabbing or feinting movements, and the exchange 17 of few heavy blows, such as occurs in a practice or exhibition 18 boxing match;

19 36. <u>40.</u> "Telecast promoter", for purposes of Section 622 of 20 this title, means any promoter who shows or causes to be shown in 21 this state a closed-circuit telecast of any professional boxing 22 <u>combative sports</u> event, whether or not the telecast or event 23 originates in this state. "Telecast promoter" shall not include a 24 cable system operator;

1 37. <u>41.</u> "Trainer" means an individual who assists, coaches, or 2 instructs any professional boxer <u>combative sports practitioner</u> or 3 amateur mixed martial arts participant <u>artist</u> with respect to 4 physical conditioning, strategy, techniques, or preparation for 5 competition, professional boxing <u>combative sports</u> contests, or 6 professional exhibitions; and

7 38. <u>42.</u> "Vendor" means any individual, firm, organization, 8 club, or corporation that participates in the conduct of a 9 professional boxing contest, <u>combative sports event or</u> amateur mixed 10 martial arts contest, <u>or professional exhibition event</u> by offering 11 for sale food or merchandise, including, but not limited to, wearing 12 apparel, alcoholic and nonalcoholic beverages, souvenirs, and 13 programs.

19 "SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2011, Section 606, is
20 amended to read as follows:

Section 606. A. The Oklahoma State Athletic Commission is hereby vested with jurisdiction to issue sanctioning permits for all professional boxing combative sports contests, and exhibitions and for all amateur mixed martial arts contests, and professional

1 exhibitions held or given within this state and to issue licenses 2 for participants of sanctioned contests and exhibitions. 3 1. No person shall promote, nor shall any person Β. 4 participate in, a professional combative sports event or an amateur 5 mixed martial arts event unless the event is sanctioned by the 6 Commission. 7 2. Except as provided in paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection C of this section, no person shall promote an amateur combative sports 8 9 event unless the event has been sanctioned by a nationally 10 recognized amateur sanctioning body that has been approved by the 11 Commission. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this subsection shall 12 13 be punishable pursuant to the provisions of Section 615 of this 14 title. C. Specifically exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma 15 State Athletic Commission Act are the amateur combative sports 16 contests or exhibitions conducted or sponsored by: 17 1. Any school, college, or university where the participants 18 are students regularly enrolled in such institutions and the 19 20 instructors, coaches, and trainers are employees of such institutions. The term "school, college, or university" shall not 21 include a school or other institution whose principal purpose is to 22 furnish instruction in boxing combative sports or sparring; 23 24

2. Any military installation or branch of the Armed Forces
 where the participants are employed by the military installation or
 are members of the branch of the Armed Forces sponsoring the contest
 or exhibition; and

5 3. Amateur boxing matches combative sports events which are sanctioned by a Commission-approved and nationally recognized 6 amateur sanctioning body. To obtain an exemption from the Oklahoma 7 State Athletic Commission Act under this paragraph, a The nationally 8 9 recognized amateur sanctioning body must present itself to the 10 Commission and provide a copy of its rules and bylaws for Commission 11 review and approval. Upon approval, the Commission, or its designated representatives, may visit, attend, investigate and 12 13 audit, as the Commission deems necessary, any match, event, sanctioning body office or event office for the purpose of 14 15 determining whether the rules and bylaws of the amateur sanctioning body as submitted to the Commission are being followed. 16 The 17 Commission administrator shall immediately rescind approval of any nationally recognized amateur sanctioning body, pending a hearing, 18 if said sanctioning body is found to be negligent or noncommittal in 19 20 the enforcement of the rules and bylaws presented to and approved by 21 the Commission.

22 C. D. The following persons are specifically exempt from the 23 provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act:
