11 [ Physician Manpower Training Commission - Oklahoma  
12 Hospital Residency Training Program Act - provide  
13 certain funding - reporting mechanisms - advisory  
14 board - effective date -

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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there  
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:  
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1 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma  
2 Hospital Residency Training Program Act".

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there  
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

7 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new  
8 residency training programs under the rules established by the  
9 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities  
10 authorized to establish residency training programs; and

11 2. "Residency training program" means post-medical-school  
12 graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and  
13 Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies  
14 of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training  
15 disciplines of family medicine, emergency medicine, general internal  
16 medicine, general pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology.

17 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency  
21 Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower  
22 Training Commission.

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1 B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
2 Program shall be to establish new residency training programs  
3 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
4 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in  
5 eligible hospitals, subject to the availability of funding.

6 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there  
8 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in  
10 consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of  
11 Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of  
12 Medicine, designate hospitals for the creation of new residency  
13 training programs.

14 B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by  
15 contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the  
16 establishment of new residency training programs.

17 C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission is authorized to  
18 contract with eligible hospitals to provide funding for the  
19 establishment of new residency training programs affiliated with the  
20 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the  
21 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine.

22 D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the  
23 assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
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1 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide  
2 technical assistance to ensure that residency training programs  
3 established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
4 Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid  
5 Services.

6 E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish  
7 reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of  
8 progress of the new residency training programs.

9 F. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a  
10 report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
11 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,  
12 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month  
13 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which  
14 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the  
15 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency  
16 Training Program Act.

17 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a  
21 residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of  
22 eligible hospitals, to prioritize the funding needs of eligible  
23 hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
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1 Program Act, and to ensure that rural and underserved areas in the  
2 state are given priority.

3 B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the  
4 Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
5 Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of  
6 Medicine, the Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for  
7 Rural Health, a representative from a statewide association of  
8 community-based health care providers, and a representative from a  
9 statewide association of hospitals.

10 C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a  
11 recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.

12 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there  
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
16 for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the  
17 "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". The  
18 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
19 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the  
20 Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal  
21 funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to  
22 or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies  
23 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may

1 be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training  
2 Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital  
3 Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be  
4 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims  
5 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of State  
6 Finance for approval and payment.

7 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

8 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
9 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
10 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
11 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
