



1        2. Assist a voter in requesting absentee ballots, other than  
2 for himself or herself or a member of his or her household;

3        3. Receive by mail an absentee ballot on behalf of a voter,  
4 other than for himself or herself or a member of his or her  
5 household; or

6        4. Submit a completed absentee ballot on behalf of a voter  
7 other than for himself or herself.

8        B. A notary public shall maintain a log of all absentee ballot  
9 affidavits that he or she notarizes for a period of at least two (2)  
10 years after the date of the election.

11        C. A notary public shall be authorized to notarize a maximum of  
12 twenty (20) absentee ballot affidavits for a single election.  
13 Provided, a notary public may be authorized to notarize more than  
14 twenty (20) absentee ballot affidavits with the written approval of  
15 the secretary of the county election board.

16        D. If more than ten (10) absentee ballots for a single election  
17 are requested to be mailed to a single mailing address, the  
18 secretary of the county election board shall immediately notify the  
19 district attorney for that county and the Secretary of the State  
20 Election Board. Provided, this requirement shall not apply to  
21 requests for ballots to be sent to nursing homes, veterans centers,  
22 medical facilities, multi-unit housing, addresses of uniformed or  
23 overseas voters as defined by the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens

1 Absentee Voting Act, or other locations authorized in writing by the  
2 Secretary of the State Election Board.
