

- 1 1. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and
2 Dangerous Drugs Control;
- 3 2. The Director of the Department of Human Services or a
4 designee;
- 5 3. The Commissioner of the State Department of Health or a
6 designee;
- 7 4. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction or a
8 designee;
- 9 5. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and
10 Substance Abuse Services or a designee;
- 11 6. The Executive Coordinator of the District Attorneys Council
12 or a designee;
- 13 7. The Director of the Oklahoma Commission on Children and
14 Youth or a designee;
- 15 8. Two members appointed by the Director of the Oklahoma State
16 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, one of whom shall
17 be a representative of the Children's Advocacy Centers of Oklahoma,
18 Inc., and one of whom shall be a representative of a statewide
19 organization of mental health professionals;
- 20 9. Two members to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
21 the Senate, one of whom shall be a member of the Senate, and one of
22 whom shall be from a statewide organization of medical doctors; and
- 23 10. Two members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
24 Representatives, one of whom shall be a member of the House of

1 Representatives, and one of whom shall be from a statewide
2 organization of osteopathic doctors.

3 B. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and
4 Dangerous Drugs Control shall be the Chair of the Board. The Chair
5 shall call the first meeting no later than November 1, 2012, and the
6 Board shall meet at least quarterly thereafter. A majority of the
7 members present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum to conduct
8 business. During the first meeting, the Board shall adopt rules of
9 procedure for the orderly performance of its functions. Further,
10 the Board shall develop confidentiality statements and interagency
11 agreements signed by member agencies that specify the cooperative
12 effort of the member agencies to the team. The Oklahoma State
13 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall provide such
14 staff support as is required by the Board.

15 C. The duties of the Oklahoma Drug-Endangered Children's
16 Alliance Board shall include:

17 1. Providing oversight for six (6) regional Oklahoma Drug-
18 Endangered Children's groups to encourage consistency in the
19 implementation of protocols and procedures for responding to drug-
20 endangered children;

21 2. Collecting statistical data from the Department of Human
22 Services concerning drug-endangered children;

23 3. Assessing the needs of drug-endangered children in Oklahoma
24 and making recommendations;

1 4. Providing training regarding drug-endangered children;

2 5. Attempting to secure funding to support Oklahoma Drug-
3 Endangered Children efforts in Oklahoma; and

4 6. Demonstrating willingness to work alongside nationally
5 recognized drug-endangered children organizations to identify,
6 address and evaluate promising practices.

7 D. Members of the Oklahoma Drug-Endangered Children's Alliance
8 Board shall receive no compensation for serving on the Board, but
9 shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:

10 1. Legislative members of the Board shall be reimbursed for
11 their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their
12 duties in accordance with Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
13 Statutes;

14 2. Nonlegislative members of the Board shall be reimbursed for
15 their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their
16 duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

17 3. Members of the Board who are not otherwise officers or
18 employees of the state shall be reimbursed by the Oklahoma State
19 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control in accordance with
20 the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

21 E. The Board shall issue a report to the Governor, President
22 Pro Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House of
23 Representatives no later than December 1, 2013, and December 1 of
24 each year thereafter.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

2 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
5 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
