

1 and repeal such reasonable ordinance, resolutions, rules,
2 regulations and orders as it shall deem necessary for the
3 management, government and use of such airport or air navigation
4 facility under its control, whether situated within or without the
5 territorial limits of the municipality. For the enforcement
6 thereof, the municipality, may, by ordinance or resolution, as may
7 by law be appropriate, appoint airport guards or police, with full
8 police powers, and fix penalties, within the limits prescribed by
9 law, for the violation of the aforesaid ordinances, resolutions,
10 rules, regulations and orders. Enforcement may also be conducted by
11 airport officers holding a commission from and employed by an
12 airport trust as defined in, and pursuant to and in accordance with,
13 the provisions and requirements of the Oklahoma Campus Security Act,
14 and who, as a result of which, hold full police powers. Said
15 penalties shall be enforced in the same manner in which penalties
16 prescribed by other ordinances, or resolutions of the municipality
17 are enforced. To the extent that an airport or other air navigation
18 facility controlled and operated by a municipality is located
19 outside the territorial limits of the municipality, it shall,
20 subject to federal and state laws, rules and regulations, be under
21 the jurisdiction and control of the municipality controlling or
22 operating it, and no other municipality shall have any authority to
23 charge or exact a license fee or occupation tax for operations
24 thereon.

1 (b) Conformity to Federal and State Law. All ordinances,
2 resolutions, rules, regulations or orders which are issued by the
3 municipality shall be kept in substantial conformity with the laws
4 of this state or any regulations promulgated or standards
5 established pursuant thereto, and, as nearly as may be, with the
6 federal laws governing aeronautics and the rules, regulations and
7 standards duly issued thereunder.

8 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 360.16, is
9 amended to read as follows:

10 Section 360.16. As used in the Oklahoma Campus Security Act:

11 1. "Campus" means the real property, buildings and other
12 improvements within this state owned, leased or rented by an
13 institution of higher education ~~or~~, a public school district or an
14 airport public trust, as defined in this section;

15 2. "Campus police officer" means an individual holding a
16 commission from and employed by an institution of higher education
17 ~~or~~, a public school district or an airport public trust pursuant to
18 the Oklahoma Campus Security Act, who may also be known as a "campus
19 public safety officer", an "airport officer", an "airport police
20 officer" or an "airport security officer";

21 3. "Commission" means a certificate of appointment by the
22 governing board of an institution of higher education or a board of
23 education of a public school district of an individual certified as
24

1 a full-time police or peace officer pursuant to Section 3311 of
2 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3 4. "Governing board" means the board of regents or trustees
4 which determines management policy and has responsibility for the
5 general government of an institution of higher education or the
6 board of education of a public school district;

7 5. "Institution of higher education" means a college,
8 university, higher educational center, or other constituent agency
9 of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education or a private
10 college or university in this state whose accreditation is
11 recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
12 pursuant to Section 4103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; ~~and~~

13 6. "Public school district" means all free schools supported by
14 public taxation and shall include K-12 schools and technology center
15 schools; and

16 7 "Airport public trust" means a public trust created under the
17 laws of this state which operates an airport and whose beneficiary
18 is an Oklahoma municipality or a combination of one or more Oklahoma
19 municipalities and/or one or more Oklahoma counties.

20 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 360.17, is
21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 360.17. A. The jurisdiction of campus police officers
23 includes the campus and pursuant to an agreement authorized by ~~this~~
24 ~~act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of this title, the highways, streets,

1 roads, alleys, easements, and other public ways immediately adjacent
2 to their campus and any other areas authorized by such agreement.
3 This delineation of jurisdiction, however, shall not be understood
4 as limiting the completion of any necessary enforcement activities
5 which began within these jurisdictions and are in compliance with
6 the agreements made with the municipality or county sheriff pursuant
7 to ~~this act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of this title. In the absence of
8 an agreement, only those law enforcement activities which began on
9 campus may be completed off campus and such activities must be
10 completed in a timely manner. Such law enforcement activities shall
11 only be authorized if the campus police have coordinated the
12 activities with the local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction
13 in that off campus area. In addition, a campus police officer shall
14 have jurisdiction in other locations pursuant to an agreement
15 authorized by ~~this act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of this title. Such
16 agreement may authorize the chief administrative officer of the law
17 enforcement agency to request assistance pursuant to the agreement.
18 Campus police officers, commissioned pursuant to ~~this act~~ Section
19 360.15 et seq. of this title, shall have the same powers,
20 liabilities, and immunities as sheriffs or police officers within
21 their jurisdiction.

22 B. As limited by law, the provisions of this section, and the
23 governing board, a CLEET certified campus police officer shall have
24 the authority to enforce:

- 1 1. State criminal statutes;
- 2 2. Municipal ordinances, if authorized by an agreement with the
- 3 municipality; and
- 4 3. Rules and regulations of the school ~~or~~, institution of
- 5 higher education or airport public trust or its beneficiary
- 6 employing such campus police officer.

7 C. As limited by law, the provisions of this section, and the

8 governing board, the campus police department shall have the same

9 authority as a municipal police department.

10 D. Campus police departments formed by private institutions of

11 higher education pursuant to ~~this act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of this

12 title shall be deemed to be public agencies in the State of Oklahoma

13 for the limited purposes of enforcing the criminal statutes of

14 Oklahoma and making agreements with local law enforcement agencies

15 or political subdivisions of the state pursuant to ~~this act~~ Section

16 360.15 et seq. of this title, provided, that the trustees of airport

17 public trusts shall also be deemed to be a public agency of this

18 state as provided in Section 179 of Title 60 of the Oklahoma

19 Statutes.

20 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 360.18, is

21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 360.18. A. Governing boards of institutions of higher

23 education ~~and~~, boards of education of public school districts and

24 airport public trusts are authorized to establish campus police

1 departments pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Campus
2 Security Act. In the case of airport public trusts operating more
3 than one airport, the board of trustees of such airport public trust
4 is authorized to establish campus police departments at any airport
5 it operates, but is not required to establish campus police
6 departments at all airports operated by such airport public trust.
7 These boards may employ and commission campus police officers and
8 may designate uniforms, badges and insignia to be worn by such
9 officers and displayed on vehicles or other equipment of the
10 department. Campus police departments shall use the following words
11 or phrases, alone or in any combination, in conjunction with the
12 uniform, badges, insignia or on vehicles utilized by these
13 departments: university police, university public safety
14 department, campus police department, campus police officer, campus
15 public safety department, campus public safety officer, airport
16 officer, airport police officer, airport security officer, airport
17 public safety officer or any standardized title such as director,
18 chief, major, captain, lieutenant, sergeant, or corporal. Upon
19 appointment, each such officer shall be given a written commission,
20 with a photo identification, evidencing the officer's appointment
21 and authority. The form of this commission shall be prescribed by
22 the governing boards specified in ~~this act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of
23 this title. Persons employed by a governing board which has
24 established a campus police department but who are not campus police

1 officers shall not be permitted to wear uniforms, badges or insignia
2 specified in this subsection or receive commissions or photo
3 identification of the type provided campus police officers.

4 B. The commission of a campus police officer may be suspended
5 or revoked by the governing board for any reason. Such commission
6 also may be suspended or revoked by the district attorney in whose
7 district the officer is employed for cause related to the campus
8 police officer's ability to exercise the powers of such commission
9 in the interest of public security or suspended or revoked by the
10 district attorney upon conviction of the campus police officer for
11 larceny, theft, embezzlement, false pretense, fraud, any
12 nonconsensual sex offense, any offense involving a minor as a
13 victim, any offense involving the possession, use, distribution or
14 sale of a controlled dangerous substance, or any offense involving a
15 firearm. The commission of a campus police officer convicted of a
16 felony or of a crime involving moral turpitude shall be revoked by
17 the district attorney upon conviction. The commission of a campus
18 police officer no longer employed by the governing board, except an
19 officer who is retiring, shall be relinquished to the board, or its
20 representative, at the time of cessation of said employment. When a
21 commission is revoked or relinquished, the campus police department
22 shall take possession of all campus police officer insignia, badges,
23 identification cards and weapons issued to the officer. A person
24 who fails to relinquish said insignia, badges, identification cards

1 or weapons, upon conviction, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor
2 and shall be punished by the imposition of a fine of not more than
3 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment in the county
4 jail for not to exceed one (1) year, or by both such fine and
5 imprisonment.

6 C. Governing boards shall notify the Council on Law Enforcement
7 Education and Training (CLEET) when an officer is commissioned or a
8 commission is relinquished or revoked. The governing boards shall
9 provide CLEET with all information regarding commissioned officers
10 requested by CLEET.

11 D. A campus police officer employed pursuant to the Oklahoma
12 Campus Security Act shall not be able to participate in either the
13 Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System or the Oklahoma Law
14 Enforcement Retirement System, unless otherwise entitled to by law.

15 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 360.20, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 360.20. Municipalities and county sheriff departments
18 having overlapping or concurrent jurisdiction with a proposed campus
19 police department, may enter into agreements with the proposed
20 campus police department recognizing jurisdictional boundaries and
21 providing for mutual assistance. Any such agreements shall be
22 executed by the governing boards of the educational institution or
23 airport public trust and the governing body of the municipality or
24 sheriff, and shall not serve to prevent other law enforcement

1 agencies from having concurrent or overlapping jurisdiction.
2 Nothing in ~~this act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of this title or any
3 action pursuant to ~~this act~~ Section 360.15 et seq. of this title
4 shall be deemed to create an agent-principal relationship between
5 any campus police officer and any municipality or county.

6 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2012.
