9 **[ state government - enacting the Government  
10 Reorganization Act - defining term - modifying  
11 citation - codification - noncodification ]**

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
14 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

15 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Government  
16 Reorganization Act".

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-3.17 of Title 74, unless  
19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 Employees who share position identification numbers for a time  
21 period of one hundred eighty (180) days or more shall count in the  
22 cumulative total against the statutory limitation on full-time-  
23 equivalent employee positions for any agency.

1           SECTION 3.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section **45.10** of Title 62, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4           A. Pursuant to this act, the Director of the Office of State  
5 Finance shall cause to be published performance reporting metrics  
6 and standards for each state agency and agency-specific initiatives.  
7 These metrics shall account for input, output and outcome measures  
8 and shall include not less than three consistent scales  
9 demonstrating that a performance standard has been achieved,  
10 partially achieved or not achieved. At least one metric shall  
11 demonstrate the cost per person served by the agency.

12           B. State agencies shall provide information as required by the  
13 Director to assist in the development of performance reporting  
14 metrics and standards.

15           C. State agencies shall report information as required by the  
16 Director to assist in the determination of the agencies' success or  
17 failure to meet established performance reporting metrics.

18           D. Performance metrics showing agency and agency department-  
19 level performance shall be published and prominently featured on the  
20 state Internet portal and through the direct domain  
21 *performance.ok.gov*. This data shall be updated on a regular basis.

22           E. Performance metrics and standards shall be reviewed and  
23 approved annually.

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1 F. Each year the Director of the Office of State Finance shall  
2 publish a report identifying the lowest performing state agencies.  
3 The report shall be provided to the Governor, Speaker of the House  
4 and President Pro Tempore of the Senate and shall be electronically  
5 transmitted to all members of the House of Representatives and  
6 Senate and shall be prominently featured on the state Internet  
7 portal. The report shall also describe and rank the agencies having  
8 the highest ratio of cost per person served.

9 G. Agencies whose performance ranks in the bottom ten percent  
10 (10%) of performance in relation to the performance metrics shall be  
11 considered eligible for entering into a shared services contract for  
12 administrative services with the Office of State Finance.

13 H. An agency whose performance ranks in the bottom ten percent  
14 (10%) of performance in relation to the performance metrics may  
15 appeal this finding to the State Governmental Technology  
16 Applications Review Board and may request the State Auditor and  
17 Inspector to verify the veracity of the findings.

18 I. For the purposes of this section, "performance reporting  
19 metrics" shall mean a set of criteria which demonstrates the  
20 quantity and quality of work.
