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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
21	Hospital Residency Training Program Act".
22	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there
24	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

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- 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new residency training programs under the rules established by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities authorized to establish residency training programs;
- 2. "Residency training program" means post medical school graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training disciplines of family medicine, general internal medicine, general pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology and emergency medicine; and
- 3. "Medical education costs" means those expenses necessary to expand the entering class size of the medical schools at the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of Community Medicine.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
  Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower
  Training Commission.
- B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
  Program shall be to establish new residency training programs

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- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of Community Medicine, designate hospitals for the creation of new residency training programs.
  - B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the establishment of new residency training programs.
  - C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other stateappropriated entities are authorized to contract with eligible hospitals to provide funding for the establishment of new residency training programs affiliated with the Oklahoma State University

- College of Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma

  School of Community Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College

  of Medicine.
  - D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma School of Community Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide technical assistance and funding for the colleges' costs incurred in supporting the programs to ensure that residency training programs established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services.
  - E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of progress of the new residency training programs.
  - F. The medical schools at the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of Community Medicine shall, subject to available funding, increase the entering class size and number of graduating physicians to provide a sufficient number of Oklahoma residents to fill the residencies created by the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act for the purposes of providing health care services to the rural and urban underserved populations of Oklahoma. For purposes of the funding provided by the Oklahoma

- Hospital Residency Training Program Act, the school year 2009-2010
  shall be the base year against which class size increases are to be
  determined.
  - G. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state-appropriated entities are authorized to contract with the medical schools at the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of Community Medicine to provide funding for medical education costs for the expansion of the entering class size and increase in the number of graduating physicians serving rural and urban underserved populations in Oklahoma.
  - H. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state appropriated entities providing funding shall ensure that the allocation of funding is prioritized to accomplish the creation of new residency training programs prior to funds being allocated for medical education costs.
  - I. The Physician Manpower Training Commission and other stateappropriated entities receiving state appropriated funds pursuant to
    the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act shall
    collaborate with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, or other
    federally designated entities, to acquire federal matching funds to
    further the pursuance of the provisions of the Oklahoma Hospital
    Residency Training Program Act. The transfer of funds between state

- 1 appropriated entities pursuant to this provision are hereby 2 authorized.
- 3 J. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training 4 5 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month 6 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which 7 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the 9 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency 10 Training Program Act.
- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of eligible hospitals and to prioritize the funding needs of eligible hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act.
- B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the
  Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
  Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of
  Medicine, the Dean of the OU School of Community Medicine, the
  Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for Rural Health, a
  representative from a statewide association of community-based

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- health care providers, and a representative from a statewide
  association of hospitals.
  - C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.
  - SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for approval and payment.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

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1	SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
