15 Hospital Residency Training Program Act - provide
16 certain funding - reporting mechanisms - advisory

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
24 Hospital Residency Training Program Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

2 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new
3 residency training programs under the rules established by the
4 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities
5 authorized to establish residency training programs;

6 2. "Residency training program" means post medical school
7 graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and
8 Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies
9 of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training
10 disciplines of family medicine, general internal medicine, general
11 pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology and emergency medicine; and

12 3. "Medical education costs" means those expenses necessary to
13 expand the entering class size of the medical schools at the
14 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the
15 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of
16 Community Medicine.

17 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
21 Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower
22 Training Commission.

23 B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
24 Program shall be to establish new residency training programs

1 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
2 Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU
3 School of Community Medicine in eligible hospitals, and to expand
4 the number of physicians graduating from medical schools at the
5 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the
6 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU School of
7 Community Medicine, focused on meeting the healthcare needs of rural
8 and urban underserved populations, subject to the availability of
9 funding.

10 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there
12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in
14 consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of
15 Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine
16 and the OU School of Community Medicine, designate hospitals for the
17 creation of new residency training programs.

18 B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by
19 contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the
20 establishment of new residency training programs.

21 C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state-
22 appropriated entities are authorized to contract with eligible
23 hospitals to provide funding for the establishment of new residency
24 training programs affiliated with the Oklahoma State University

1 College of Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma
2 School of Community Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College
3 of Medicine.

4 D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the
5 assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
6 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma School of Community Medicine
7 and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide
8 technical assistance and funding for the colleges' costs incurred in
9 supporting the programs to ensure that residency training programs
10 established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
11 Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare
12 Services.

13 E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish
14 reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of
15 progress of the new residency training programs.

16 F. The medical schools at the Oklahoma State University College
17 of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of
18 Medicine and the OU School of Community Medicine shall, subject to
19 available funding, increase the entering class size and number of
20 graduating physicians to provide a sufficient number of Oklahoma
21 residents to fill the residencies created by the Oklahoma Hospital
22 Residency Training Program Act for the purposes of providing health
23 care services to the rural and urban underserved populations of
24 Oklahoma. For purposes of the funding provided by the Oklahoma

1 Hospital Residency Training Program Act, the school year 2009-2010
2 shall be the base year against which class size increases are to be
3 determined.

4 G. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state-
5 appropriated entities are authorized to contract with the medical
6 schools at the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
7 Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the OU
8 School of Community Medicine to provide funding for medical
9 education costs for the expansion of the entering class size and
10 increase in the number of graduating physicians serving rural and
11 urban underserved populations in Oklahoma.

12 H. The Physician Manpower Training Commission or other state
13 appropriated entities providing funding shall ensure that the
14 allocation of funding is prioritized to accomplish the creation of
15 new residency training programs prior to funds being allocated for
16 medical education costs.

17 I. The Physician Manpower Training Commission and other state-
18 appropriated entities receiving state appropriated funds pursuant to
19 the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act shall
20 collaborate with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, or other
21 federally designated entities, to acquire federal matching funds to
22 further the pursuance of the provisions of the Oklahoma Hospital
23 Residency Training Program Act. The transfer of funds between state
24

1 appropriated entities pursuant to this provision are hereby
2 authorized.

3 J. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a
4 report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
5 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
6 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month
7 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which
8 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the
9 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
10 Training Program Act.

11 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there
13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a
15 residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of
16 eligible hospitals and to prioritize the funding needs of eligible
17 hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
18 Program Act.

19 B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the
20 Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
21 Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of
22 Medicine, the Dean of the OU School of Community Medicine, the
23 Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for Rural Health, a
24 representative from a statewide association of community-based

1 health care providers, and a representative from a statewide
2 association of hospitals.

3 C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a
4 recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.

5 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there
7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund
9 for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the
10 "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". The
11 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
12 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the
13 Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal
14 funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to
15 or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies
16 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may
17 be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training
18 Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital
19 Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be
20 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims
21 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for
22 approval and payment.

23 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.
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1 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
3 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
