10 **[Physician Manpower Training Commission - creating a**
11 **training program - effective date -**
12 **emergency]**

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
18 Hospital Residency Training Program Act".

19 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there
21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

23 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new
24 residency training programs under the rules established by the
Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities
authorized to establish residency training programs; and

1 2. "Residency training program" means post medical school
2 graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and
3 Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies
4 of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training
5 disciplines of family medicine, general internal medicine, general
6 pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology.

7 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
11 Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower
12 Training Commission.

13 B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
14 Program shall be to establish new residency training programs
15 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
16 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in
17 eligible hospitals, subject to the availability of funding.

18 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in
22 consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of
23 Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of

1 Medicine, designate hospitals for the creation of new residency
2 training programs.

3 B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by
4 contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the
5 establishment of new residency training programs.

6 C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission is authorized to
7 contract with eligible hospitals to provide funding for the
8 establishment of new residency training programs affiliated with the
9 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the
10 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine.

11 D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the
12 assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
13 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide
14 technical assistance to ensure that residency training programs
15 established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
16 Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare
17 Services.

18 E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish
19 reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of
20 progress of the new residency training programs.

21 F. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a
22 report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
23 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
24 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month

1 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which
2 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the
3 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
4 Training Program Act.

5 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there
7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a
9 residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of
10 eligible hospitals and to prioritize the funding needs of eligible
11 hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
12 Program Act.

13 B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the
14 Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
15 Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of
16 Medicine, the Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for
17 Rural Health, a representative from a statewide association of
18 community-based health care providers, and a representative from a
19 statewide association of hospitals.

20 C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a
21 recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.

22 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund
2 for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the
3 "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". The
4 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
5 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the
6 Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal
7 funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to
8 or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies
9 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may
10 be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training
11 Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital
12 Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be
13 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims
14 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for
15 approval and payment.

16 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

17 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
18 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
