6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to elections; requiring certain
8 candidates to complete certain form; providing for
9 contents of form; providing for codification; and
10 providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-102.1 of Title 26, unless
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 All candidates filing for office with the State Election Board
17 pursuant to Section 5-102 of Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall
18 complete the following form that shall be created and administered
19 by the State Election Board:

20 Amendment I

21 Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of
22 _____, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging
23 the freedom of _____, or of the press; or the right of the

1 people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a
2 redress of grievances.

3 Amendment II

4 A well-regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a
5 free state, the right of the people to keep and bear _____ shall
6 not be infringed.

7 Amendment III

8 No soldier shall, in time of peace, be quartered in any house,
9 without the consent of the owner, nor in time of war, but in a
10 manner to be prescribed by law.

11 Amendment IV

12 The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses,
13 papers, and effects, against unreasonable _____ and
14 _____, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue,
15 but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and
16 particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or
17 things to be seized.

18 Amendment V

19 No person shall be held to answer for a capital or otherwise
20 infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand
21 Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the
22 militia, when in actual service in time of war or public danger; nor
23 shall any person be subject for the same offense to be twice put in
24 _____ of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any

1 criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of
2 life, liberty, or property without due process of law; nor shall
3 private property be taken for public use without just compensation.

4 Amendment VI

5 In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right
6 to a _____ and public trial, by an impartial jury of the
7 state and district wherein the crime shall have been committed,
8 which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to
9 be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be
10 confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory
11 process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the
12 assistance of counsel for his defense.

13 Amendment VII

14 In suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall
15 exceed Twenty Dollars (\$20.00), the right of trial by _____
16 shall be preserved, and no fact tried by a jury shall be otherwise
17 reexamined in any court of the United States, than according to the
18 rules of the common law.

19 Amendment VIII

20 Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines
21 imposed, nor _____ and _____ punishments inflicted.

22 Amendment IX

23 The enumeration in the _____, of certain rights, shall
24 not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.

1 Amendment X

2 The powers not delegated to the United States by the
3 Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to
4 the _____ respectively, or to the people.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2011.
