6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to the State Capitol Building;  
8 amending 7 O.S. 2001, Section 73, which relates to  
9 vending facilities; providing exception for areas of  
10 the State Capitol Building under management and  
11 control of Legislature; amending 73 O.S. 2001,  
12 Section 15.1, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter  
13 396, O.S.L. 2010 (73 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 15.1),  
14 which relates to management and control of space in  
15 State Capitol Building; modifying space under  
16 management and control of Legislature; and providing  
17 an effective date.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 7 O.S. 2001, Section 73, is  
20 amended to read as follows:

21 Section 73. A. It shall be the duty of the board of county  
22 commissioners of each county and the governing boards of all state  
23 institutions, state agencies and state or county public trust  
24 authorities, with regard to the premises of county or state property  
under their respective jurisdictions or the premises of property  
leased by them in whole or in part, to give priority to vending  
facilities operated by licensed blind operators and established by

1 the State Department of Rehabilitation Services. Governing boards  
2 shall observe such priority by entering into an agreement with the  
3 Department. Operators shall be licensed by the Department.

4 B. Governing boards shall make available free of any charge,  
5 fee, assessment or commission on sales adequate space with  
6 sufficient electrical, plumbing, heating and ventilation outlets for  
7 the operation of a vending facility on satisfactory sites.  
8 Governing boards shall provide free of any charge, fee, assessment  
9 or commission on sales the use of utilities needed to operate a  
10 vending facility.

11 C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the  
12 operation of fairgrounds, exposition centers, trade/consumer show  
13 facilities, pari-mutuel horse racing facilities as licensed by the  
14 Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission, parks, golf courses ~~or~~, hospitals  
15 operated by county trust authorities, or areas in the State Capitol  
16 Building under the management and control of the Legislature.

17 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2001, Section 15.1, as  
18 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 396, O.S.L. 2010 (73 O.S. Supp.  
19 2010, Section 15.1), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 15.1 A. The Legislature shall have management and  
21 control of the following space in the State Capitol Building:

- 22 1. The space on the third, fourth, fifth and sixth floors;
- 23 2. The space in the basement that is occupied by the  
24 Legislature on June 1, 1995;

1           3. Approximately six thousand nine hundred thirty-nine (6,939)  
2 square feet of space in the west wing of the first floor that is  
3 occupied by the Department of Libraries on June 1, 1995;

4           4. Approximately six thousand six hundred ninety-one (6,691)  
5 square feet of space in the west wing of the basement that is  
6 occupied by the Department of Libraries and the Department of  
7 Central Services on June 1, 1995;

8           5. Approximately three thousand seven hundred seventy (3,770)  
9 square feet of space in the west wing of the basement that is  
10 occupied by the Department of Central Services on June 1, 1995;

11           6. Approximately two thousand one hundred (2,100) square feet  
12 of space in the center of the basement that is occupied by the  
13 Department of Central Services and the Office of State Finance on  
14 June 1, 1995;

15           7. Approximately six hundred (600) square feet of space in the  
16 center of the basement that is occupied by the Department of Central  
17 Services on June 1, 1995;

18           8. Approximately two thousand three hundred one (2,301) square  
19 feet of space in the center of the basement that is occupied by the  
20 Department of Central Services on June 1, 1995;

21           9. Approximately twelve thousand five hundred sixty (12,560)  
22 square feet of space in the west wing of the first floor that is  
23 occupied by the Office of the Attorney General on June 1, 2001;  
24 provided, upon the Office of the Attorney General vacating such

1 space, any renovations thereto shall be made in such a manner as to  
2 ensure preservation and maintenance of the cultural and historic  
3 integrity of the Capitol; ~~and~~

4 10. Upon completion of the project authorized in Section 332 of  
5 this title, all space in the west wing of the second floor that is  
6 occupied by the Supreme Court, all space in the north wing of the  
7 second floor that is occupied by the Court of Criminal Appeals and  
8 any other space in the State Capitol Building that is occupied by  
9 the appellate courts prior to relocation to the Wiley Post  
10 Historical Building; provided, the Supreme Court shall continue to  
11 have exclusive management and control of the Supreme Court courtroom  
12 and designated robing room located in the west wing of the second  
13 floor and the Court of Criminal Appeals shall continue to have  
14 access to the courtroom and designated robing room located in the  
15 north wing of the second floor upon such occasions as the Presiding  
16 Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals deems necessary and  
17 appropriate;

18 11. The space in the basement that on June 1, 2010, is located  
19 to the east of the women's restroom and the House of  
20 Representatives' post office and supply room, to the south of the  
21 House of Representatives' media offices, to the west of the men's  
22 restroom and the office of the Building Superintendent, and to the  
23 north of the common hallway; and

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1       12. The space on the fourth floor that on June 1, 2010, is  
2 located to the east of Room 432A, to the south of Room 429, to the  
3 west of the women's restroom, and to the north of the rotunda.

4       B. The authority of the Legislature to allot space may be  
5 delegated to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker  
6 of the House of Representatives. Each House of the State  
7 Legislature shall have the exclusive charge of the purchase, use,  
8 allotment, and disposition of its respective chambers, committee  
9 rooms, fixtures, furniture, supplies, and apparatus, and shall be  
10 responsible for the use and preservation of same. The provisions of  
11 this section shall not prohibit the Legislature from allowing  
12 agencies of the executive or judicial departments to use space  
13 within the State Capitol Building that is under its management and  
14 control.

15       C. The Legislative Service Bureau may lease the space specified  
16 in paragraphs 11 and 12 of subsection A of this section to a private  
17 vendor, but in such event the Legislative Service Bureau shall  
18 retain authority of any such lease. It is the intent of the  
19 Legislature that rental income and any other payments due under such  
20 a lease shall be paid to the Department of Rehabilitation Services.

21       SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2011.
