9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
11 2011, Section 3601.2, which relates to chief
12 executive officer salaries; updating year; and
13 providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, is
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 3601.2 A. Beginning January 1, ~~2010~~ 2013, the agency,
19 board, commission, department or program shall establish the salary
20 of each of the chief executive officers for which they have
21 appointing authority. Such salary shall be set between the minimum
22 and maximum of the range specified below, for full-time employees
23 only, per annum, payable monthly, pursuant to the limitations
24 outlined below:

1 1. If the chief executive officer's salary is below the minimum
 2 annual salary then it ~~can not~~ cannot be raised to more than the
 3 minimum annual salary in one (1) fiscal year. If the chief
 4 executive officer's salary is at or above the minimum annual salary
 5 then the salary may not be increased above the midpoint in one (1)
 6 fiscal year;

7 2. Such increases shall not occur more than once in a fiscal
 8 year; and

9 3. The salary of the incumbent chief executive officer shall
 10 not be increased if the officer's salary exceeds the maximum of the
 11 range.

23	B. All increases require certification of the appointing			
24	authority that said action can be implemented for the current fiscal			

1 year and subsequent fiscal year without the need for additional
2 funding. The agency, board, commission, department or program shall
3 report increases granted under this section to the Office of
4 Personnel Management on an annual basis by August 1 of each year.
5 The Office of Personnel management shall forward a report of such
6 increases to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and
7 Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than September 1 of
8 each year.

9 C. Every two (2) years starting FY-05, the Office of Personnel
10 Management shall review these salary ranges and report on and make
11 recommendations on proposed salary ranges in their annual
12 compensation reports mandated by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of
13 this title by no later than December 1.

14 D. Every three (3) years the Legislature shall review the
15 salary ranges specified in subsection A of this section.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 2012.
