6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to the Physician Manpower Training  
8 Commission; creating the Oklahoma Hospital Residency  
9 Training Program Act; providing short title; defining  
10 terms; creating the Oklahoma Hospital Residency  
11 Training Program to be administered by the Physician  
12 Manpower Training Commission; stating purpose of  
13 certain program; directing the creation of certain  
14 new training programs; directing the Physician  
15 Manpower Training Commission to provide certain  
16 funding; authorizing the Physician Manpower Training  
17 Commission to provide certain funding; directing  
18 certain technical assistance; requiring the  
19 establishment of certain reporting mechanisms;  
20 requiring certain report; creating certain advisory  
21 board; providing for membership of certain advisory  
22 board; specifying purpose of certain advisory board;  
23 creating the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
24 Program Revolving Fund; providing for codification;  
providing an effective date; and declaring an  
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma  
Hospital Residency Training Program Act".

1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

5 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new  
6 residency training programs under the rules established by the  
7 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities  
8 authorized to establish residency training programs; and

9 2. "Residency training program" means post medical school  
10 graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and  
11 Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies  
12 of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training  
13 disciplines of family medicine, general internal medicine, general  
14 pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology.

15 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there  
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency  
19 Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower  
20 Training Commission.

21 B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
22 Program shall be to establish new residency training programs  
23 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
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1 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in  
2 eligible hospitals, subject to the availability of funding.

3 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there  
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in  
7 consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of  
8 Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of  
9 Medicine, designate hospitals for the creation of new residency  
10 training programs.

11 B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by  
12 contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the  
13 establishment of new residency training programs.

14 C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission is authorized to  
15 contract with eligible hospitals to provide funding for the  
16 establishment of new residency training programs affiliated with the  
17 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the  
18 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine.

19 D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the  
20 assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
21 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide  
22 technical assistance to ensure that residency training programs  
23 established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
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1 Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare  
2 Services.

3 E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish  
4 reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of  
5 progress of the new residency training programs.

6 F. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a  
7 report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
8 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,  
9 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month  
10 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which  
11 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the  
12 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency  
13 Training Program Act.

14 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there  
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a  
18 residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of  
19 eligible hospitals and to prioritize the funding needs of eligible  
20 hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training  
21 Program Act.

22 B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the  
23 Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
24 Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of

1 Medicine, the Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for  
2 Rural Health, a representative from a statewide association of  
3 community-based health care providers, and a representative from a  
4 statewide association of hospitals.

5 C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a  
6 recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.

7 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there  
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
11 for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the  
12 "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". The  
13 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
14 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the  
15 Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal  
16 funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to  
17 or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies  
18 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may  
19 be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training  
20 Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital  
21 Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be  
22 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims  
23 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for  
24 approval and payment.

1 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

2 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
3 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
5 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
