6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to motor vehicles; directing the
8 issuance of certain oversize vehicle permits;
9 authorizing ninety (90) day permit; specifying size
10 requirements; providing for expiration; requiring
11 certain registration; stating fee; specifying travel
12 requirements; authorizing one-day prepaid permit;
13 requiring certain routes; specifying permit
14 requirements; stating fee; authorizing promulgation
15 of rules; providing for codification; and providing
16 an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-130 of Title 47, unless there
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 Upon the effective date of this act and in addition to the other
22 permitting procedures authorized pursuant to this chapter, the
23 Commissioner of Public Safety is directed to issue oversize permits
24 according to the following:

25 1. A ninety (90) day permit for oversized loads on state-
26 maintained roads that are no greater than thirteen (13) feet wide
27 and fourteen (14) feet high or the legal length for an overwidth

1 permit no greater than eight and one-half (8 1/2) feet wide,
2 fourteen (14) feet high, and one hundred and ten (110) feet long.
3 For vehicles and loads on a trailer for an overlength permit, the
4 size shall be no longer than seventy-five (75) feet for single
5 vehicles moving empty or hauling a load. Portable buildings and
6 manufactured homes shall not be authorized to obtain a permit
7 pursuant to this section.

8 The permit expires ninety (90) days from the date specified on
9 the application of when movement begins. The vehicle shall be
10 properly registered with this state according to law; the vehicle
11 tag number shall accompany the application, and a permit issued
12 shall be assigned to that vehicle tag number only. A permit shall
13 not be issued to a vehicle with temporary registration.

14 The fee for a ninety (90) day permit shall be Two Hundred Forty
15 Dollars (\$240.00). The permittee shall be responsible for obtaining
16 routing and any current restrictions on eligible roads. The
17 permittee shall not travel over load-posted bridges that exceed
18 capacity. Travel shall be for daylight hours only unless the load
19 does not exceed ten (10) feet wide or one hundred (100) feet long
20 with legal front and rear overhang; then the vehicle may travel at
21 night on the interstate system only. Permits may not be amended or
22 transferred between vehicles or permittees.

23 2. A one-day prepaid permit for oversized loads on pre-approved
24 routes as obtained by the applicant through the proper routing

1 requirements. The permit shall be assigned to a route and the
2 applicant shall include the vehicle tag number and a trailer tag
3 number, if applicable, to be assigned to the permit. The permittee
4 may activate the one-day permit online. Such permits shall only be
5 valid for one (1) year from the date the prepaid permit was
6 authorized by the Department of Public Safety. The fee for a one-
7 day prepaid permit shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

8 The Department is authorized to promulgate any rules necessary
9 for the implementation of this act.

10 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2012.

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
