5 AS INTRODUCED

6 An Act relating to motor vehicle registration;
7 requiring cotton module vehicles to be licensed;
8 providing for apportionment of license fee; requiring
9 Oklahoma Tax Commission to design license plate and
10 providing for its use; requiring certain affidavit;
11 providing exemption; providing for codification; and
12 providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1134.4 of Title 47, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. For each motor vehicle used for the purpose of transporting
18 cotton modules from the point of production to the first point of
19 delivery or cotton gin, the annual license fee shall be Sixty
20 Dollars (\$60.00). Fees collected pursuant to this section shall be
21 apportioned as follows:

22 1. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be apportioned to the Department
23 of Public Safety Revolving Fund; and

24 2. Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) shall be apportioned pursuant to
Section 1104 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

1 B. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall design appropriate license
2 plates for all vehicles registered pursuant to this section. The
3 license plates shall be permanent in nature and shall be designed in
4 a manner as to remain with the vehicle for the duration of the
5 vehicle's life span or until the title is transferred or the vehicle
6 is no longer used for the purposes specified in subsection A of this
7 section.

8 C. Before a person shall be allowed to license a vehicle
9 pursuant to this section, the person shall sign an affidavit
10 attesting to the fact that the person is familiar with the purposes
11 for which the vehicle may be used and that the person will not use
12 the vehicle for any other purpose. Any person who signs an
13 affidavit when the person does not believe that the information in
14 the affidavit is true or knows it is not true, upon conviction,
15 shall be guilty of perjury and shall be punished as provided for by
16 law. A violation of the provisions of this section shall also be
17 grounds for revocation of the driver license of the person.

18 D. A motor vehicle subject to the license requirement in this
19 section shall be exempt from the license required pursuant to
20 Section 1133 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2013.
