6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to fishing and hunting licenses;
8 amending 29 O.S. 2001, Sections 4-110, 4-112 and 4-
9 114, as last amended by Sections 3, 4 and 6, Chapter
10 317, O.S.L. 2010 (29 O.S. Supp. 2010, Sections 4-110,
11 4-112 and 4-114), which relate to fishing and hunting
12 licenses and combination lifetime fishing and hunting
13 licenses; adding exemptions; and providing an
14 effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2001, Section 4-110, as
17 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 317, O.S.L. 2010 (29 O.S. Supp.
18 2010, Section 4-110), is amended to read as follows:

19 Section 4-110. A. Except as otherwise provided in the Oklahoma
20 Wildlife Conservation Code, no person shall fish, pursue, harass,
21 catch, kill, take in any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or
22 transport all or any portion of fish without having first procured a
23 license for such from the Director or from any of the authorized
24 agents of the Department of Wildlife Conservation. The Wildlife
25 Conservation Commission may designate two (2) days per year in which

1 residents and nonresidents may fish without first procuring a
2 fishing license pursuant to the provisions of this section.

3 B. The following legal residents of Oklahoma shall be exempt
4 from the annual fishing license requirements of subsection C of this
5 section and the following nonresidents shall be exempt from the
6 annual nonresident fishing licenses required pursuant to subsection
7 E of this section:

8 1. Legal residents under sixteen (16) years of age and
9 nonresidents under sixteen (16) years of age from states which do
10 not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons under sixteen
11 (16) years of age;

12 2. Legal residents sixty-five (65) years of age or older and
13 nonresidents sixty-five (65) years of age or older from states which
14 do not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons sixty-five
15 (65) years of age or older, provided a legal resident has obtained a
16 senior citizen lifetime fishing or combination hunting and fishing
17 license pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-114 of this title;

18 3. Legal residents born on or before January 1, 1923;

19 4. Legal resident veterans having a disability of sixty percent
20 (60%) or more;

21 5. Legal resident owners or tenants, their spouses, parents,
22 grandparents, children and their spouses, grandchildren and their
23 spouses who fish in private ponds on land owned or leased by them;

1 6. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a patient of an
2 institution of the State of Oklahoma established for the care and
3 treatment of mental illness or alcohol or drug dependency or any
4 developmentally disabled person residing in any group home or other
5 institution or developmentally disabled persons when accompanied by
6 an attendant of the institution or legal guardian of the patient, or
7 when fishing on institutional property;

8 7. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
9 of age who is in the legal and physical custody of the State of
10 Oklahoma or one of its agencies by court order;

11 8. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
12 of age who is in the physical custody of a child care facility as
13 defined by Section 402 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

14 9. Any legal resident or nonresident who is legally blind or
15 who has any other physical impairment, as certified by a physician
16 licensed in this state or any state which borders this state, which
17 prevents the person from properly using fishing apparatus without
18 the assistance of another person, and any one person actually
19 accompanying and actually assisting such legally blind or otherwise
20 physically impaired person while the latter is fishing. This
21 certification shall be carried by the individual while fishing;

22 10. Nonresidents under fourteen (14) years of age;

23 11. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a Job Corps
24 trainee of this state, provided that the trainees shall have on

1 their persons a duly authorized identification card issued by their
2 respective Job Corps Center and shall present the card upon request,
3 in lieu of a fishing license. The trainees shall return their cards
4 to their respective Job Corps Center when the trainees leave their
5 respective Job Corps training programs;

6 12. Any legal resident having a proven disability which renders
7 the resident nonambulatory and confined to a wheelchair as certified
8 by a physician licensed in this state or any state which borders
9 this state;

10 13. Any legal resident who is fishing with a pole and line,
11 trotline, or throwline in streams, natural lakes, natural ponds, and
12 mine pits in the county in which the person is a resident, or in
13 streams, natural lakes, natural ponds, and mine pits which form a
14 part of the boundary line of the county in which the person is a
15 resident, when using any bait other than commercial or artificial
16 bait, blood, stink bait, cut fish, and shrimp; ~~and~~

17 14. Any legal resident or nonresident participating in an
18 aquatic education event or clinic sanctioned by the Department of
19 Wildlife Conservation; and

20 15. Any legal resident who as a firefighter or law enforcement
21 officer suffered a disability in the line of duty of sixty percent
22 (60%) or more.

1 C. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife
2 Conservation Code, the resident fishing licenses issued pursuant to
3 the provisions of this section and the fee for each shall be:

4 1. Annual fishing license for legal residents eighteen (18)
5 years of age and older - Twenty-four Dollars (\$24.00);

6 2. Annual fishing license for legal residents sixteen (16) or
7 seventeen (17) years of age - Four Dollars (\$4.00); and

8 3. Two-day fishing license for legal residents - Fourteen
9 Dollars (\$14.00).

10 D. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of
11 paragraphs 1 and 3 of subsection C of this section, Five Dollars
12 (\$5.00) of the license fee shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land
13 Stamp and shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund
14 created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-141 of this title.

15 E. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife
16 Conservation Code, the nonresident fishing licenses issued pursuant
17 to the provisions of this section and the fee for each shall be:

18 1. Annual fishing license for nonresidents - Fifty-four Dollars
19 (\$54.00), provided the Commission may enter into reciprocity
20 agreements with states wherein nonresident license fees shall be in
21 conformity with such reciprocal agreements; and

22 2. Six-day fishing license for nonresidents - Thirty-four
23 Dollars (\$34.00).

1 F. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of
2 paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection E of this section, Five Dollars
3 (\$5.00) of the annual license fee for nonresidents, and One Dollar
4 and fifty cents (\$1.50) of the six-day fishing license for
5 nonresidents fee shall be deposited in the Wildlife Land Acquisition
6 Fund created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-132 of this
7 title. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of
8 paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection E of this section, Five Dollars
9 (\$5.00) of the license fee shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land
10 Stamp and shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund
11 created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-141 of this title.

12 G. Legal residents who have resided in this state for at least
13 six (6) months and who are receiving Social Security Disability
14 benefits, Supplemental Security Income benefits, disability benefits
15 under the Railroad Retirement Act, 45 U.S.C.A., Section 231a,
16 postal employees receiving disability benefits pursuant to 5,
17 U.S.C., Section 8451 (1998) or legal residents who are one hundred
18 percent (100%) disabled and are receiving disability payments from
19 the Multiple Injury Trust Fund pursuant to Section 173 of Title 85
20 of the Oklahoma Statutes, may purchase a disability fishing license
21 from the Director for Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for five (5) years.

22 H. 1. Any person arrested while violating the provisions of
23 this section who does not meet the requirements of subsection K of
24 this section, may purchase a substitute temporary thirty-day license

1 from the arresting game warden in lieu of posting bond. The fee for
2 a substitute license purchased pursuant to the provisions of this
3 subsection shall be:

4 a. for legal residents, Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and

5 b. for nonresidents, Ninety Dollars (\$90.00).

6 2. Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the fees
7 from licenses purchased pursuant to the provisions of this
8 subsection shall be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund to
9 be used exclusively for developing, managing, preserving, and
10 protecting wildlife and wildlife habitat.

11 I. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for by
12 subsection H of this section, any resident of this state convicted
13 of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by the
14 imposition of a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00)
15 nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) or by imprisonment in
16 the county jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by
17 both ~~said~~ such fine and imprisonment.

18 J. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for by
19 subsection H of this section, any nonresident convicted of violating
20 this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty
21 Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) or by
22 imprisonment in the county jail for a period not more than thirty
23 (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

24

1 K. Any person producing proof in court that a current fishing
2 license issued by the Department of Wildlife Conservation to that
3 person was in force at the time of the alleged offense shall be
4 entitled to dismissal of a charge of violating this section upon
5 payment of court costs. If proof of a current fishing license
6 issued by the Department to the person that was in force at the time
7 of the alleged offense is presented to the court or district
8 attorney within seventy-two (72) hours after the violation, the
9 charge shall be dismissed without payment of court costs.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2001, Section 4-112, as
11 last amended by Section 4, Chapter 317, O.S.L. 2010 (29 O.S. Supp.
12 2010, Section 4-112), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 4-112. A. Except as otherwise provided for in the
14 Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code or the Oklahoma Farmed Cervidae
15 Act, no person may hunt, pursue, trap, harass, catch, kill, take or
16 attempt to take in any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or
17 transport all or any portion of any wildlife except fish, without
18 having first procured a license from the Department of Wildlife
19 Conservation. The Wildlife Conservation Commission shall designate
20 a consecutive Saturday and Sunday in September of each year as free
21 hunting days in which residents of this state may hunt without first
22 procuring a hunting license pursuant to the provisions of this
23 section.

24

1 B. The following legal residents of Oklahoma shall be exempt
2 from the annual hunting license requirement of paragraph 1 of
3 subsection E of this section and the following nonresidents shall be
4 exempt from the annual nonresident hunting licenses required
5 pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection C of this section:

- 6 1. Legal residents under sixteen (16) years of age;
- 7 2. Legal residents sixty-five (65) years of age or older
8 provided they have obtained a senior citizen lifetime hunting or
9 combination hunting and fishing license pursuant to the provisions
10 of Section 4-114 of this title;
- 11 3. Legal residents born on or before January 1, 1923;
- 12 4. Legal resident veterans having a disability of sixty percent
13 (60%) or more;
- 14 5. Legal resident owners or tenants who hunt on land owned or
15 leased by them;
- 16 6. Any nonresident under fourteen (14) years of age;
- 17 7. Legal residents having a proven disability which renders
18 them nonambulatory and confines them to a wheelchair, as certified
19 by a physician licensed in this state or in any state which borders
20 this state;
- 21 8. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
22 of age who is in the physical custody of a child care facility as
23 defined by Section 402 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

24

1 9. Any legal resident or nonresident hunting, pursuing,
2 trapping, harassing, catching, killing, taking, or attempting to
3 take in any manner any species of rattlesnake during an organized
4 rattlesnake-hunting event or festival and who has a rattlesnake
5 permit issued pursuant to Section 4-143 of this title; and

6 10. Any legal resident who as a firefighter or law enforcement
7 officer suffered a disability in the line of duty of sixty percent
8 (60%) or more.

9 C. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife
10 Conservation Code, the nonresident hunting licenses issued pursuant
11 to this section and the fee for each license shall be:

12 1. Annual hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other
13 than deer, antelope, elk or bear which expires on December 31 of the
14 year purchased - One Hundred Forty-one Dollars (\$141.00).

15 Nonresidents hunting big game or combination big game and upland
16 game in a commercial hunting area shall be required to have this
17 license;

18 2. Annual hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other
19 than deer, antelope, elk or bear which expires on June 30 of the
20 fiscal year purchased - One Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00).

21 Nonresidents hunting big game or combination big game and upland
22 game in a commercial hunting area shall be required to have this
23 license;

1 3. Gun hunting license for deer for nonresidents which shall be
2 valid for hunting all deer allowed during the current calendar year
3 deer gun season - Two Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars (\$279.00);

4 4. Archery hunting license for deer for nonresidents which
5 shall be valid for hunting all deer allowed during the current
6 calendar year deer archery season - Two Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars
7 (\$279.00);

8 5. Primitive firearms hunting license for deer for nonresidents
9 which shall be valid for hunting all deer allowed during the current
10 calendar year deer primitive firearms season - Two Hundred Seventy-
11 nine Dollars (\$279.00);

12 6. Hunting license for antelope for nonresidents - Three
13 Hundred Five Dollars (\$305.00);

14 7. Hunting license for elk for nonresidents - Three Hundred
15 Five Dollars (\$305.00);

16 8. Five-day hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other
17 than deer, antelope, elk, turkey or bear - Seventy-four Dollars
18 (\$74.00); and

19 9. Ten-day hunting license for nonresidents hunting small game
20 in a commercial hunting area - Five Dollars (\$5.00).

21 D. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of
22 subsection C of this section:

23 1. Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the license fee of each license
24 issued pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 7 of subsection C of this

1 section and Two Dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) of the license fee
2 for each license issued pursuant to paragraph 8 of subsection C of
3 this section shall be deposited in the Wildlife Land Acquisition
4 Fund created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-132 of this
5 title; and

6 2. Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the license fee for each license
7 issued pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 8 of subsection C of this
8 section shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp and shall be
9 deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund created pursuant to the
10 provisions of Section 4-141 of this title.

11 E. Except as otherwise provided, the resident hunting licenses
12 issued pursuant to this section and the fee for each license shall
13 be:

14 1. Annual hunting license for residents eighteen (18) years of
15 age and older which expires on December 31 of the year purchased -
16 Twenty-four Dollars (\$24.00);

17 2. Annual hunting license for residents eighteen (18) years of
18 age and older which expires on June 30 of the fiscal year purchased
19 - Thirty-one Dollars (\$31.00);

20 3. Annual hunting license for residents sixteen (16) or
21 seventeen (17) years of age which expires on December 31 of the year
22 purchased - Four Dollars (\$4.00);

23

1 4. Annual hunting license for residents sixteen (16) or
2 seventeen (17) years of age which expires on June 30 of the fiscal
3 year purchased - Six Dollars (\$6.00);

4 5. Ten-day hunting license for residents for small game in a
5 commercial hunting area - Five Dollars (\$5.00);

6 6. Five-year disability hunting license for residents of this
7 state for at least six (6) months who are receiving Social Security
8 Disability benefits, Supplemental Security Income benefits or
9 disability benefits under the Railroad Retirement Act, 45 U.S.C.A.,
10 Section 231a, or residents who are one-hundred-percent disabled and
11 are receiving disability payments from the Multiple Injury Trust
12 Fund pursuant to Section 173 of Title 85 of the Oklahoma Statutes -
13 Ten Dollars (\$10.00);

14 7. Gun hunting license for deer for residents eighteen (18)
15 years of age or older - Nineteen Dollars (\$19.00). The following
16 persons shall be exempt:

17 a. residents with proper certification from the United
18 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its
19 successor, certifying that the person is a disabled
20 veteran in receipt of compensation at the one-hundred-
21 percent rate, and

22 b. residents hunting in big game or combination big game
23 and upland game commercial hunting areas;

24

1 8. Gun hunting license for deer for residents under eighteen
2 (18) years of age - Nine Dollars (\$9.00);

3 9. Archery hunting license for deer for residents eighteen (18)
4 years of age or older - Nineteen Dollars (\$19.00). The following
5 persons shall be exempt:

6 a. residents with proper certification from the United
7 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its
8 successor, certifying that the person is a disabled
9 veteran in receipt of compensation at the one-hundred-
10 percent rate, and

11 b. residents hunting in big game or combination big game
12 and upland game commercial hunting areas;

13 10. Archery hunting license for deer for residents under
14 eighteen (18) years of age - Nine Dollars (\$9.00);

15 11. Primitive firearms hunting license for deer for residents
16 eighteen (18) years of age or older - Nineteen Dollars (\$19.00).

17 The following persons shall be exempt:

18 a. residents with proper certification from the United
19 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its
20 successor, certifying that the person is a disabled
21 veteran in receipt of compensation at the one-hundred-
22 percent rate, and

23 b. residents hunting in big game or combination big game
24 and upland game commercial hunting areas;

1 12. Primitive firearms hunting license for deer for residents
2 under eighteen (18) years of age - Nine Dollars (\$9.00);

3 13. Hunting license for elk for residents - Fifty Dollars
4 (\$50.00). Residents hunting in big game or combination big game and
5 upland game commercial hunting areas shall be exempt from this
6 license;

7 14. Hunting license for antelope for residents - Fifty Dollars
8 (\$50.00). Residents hunting in big game or combination big game and
9 upland game commercial hunting areas shall be exempt from this
10 license; and

11 15. Bonus, special or additional gun hunting license for deer
12 for residents - Nineteen Dollars (\$19.00). The following persons
13 shall be exempt:

14 a. residents with proper certification from the United
15 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its
16 successor, certifying that the person is a disabled
17 veteran in receipt of compensation at the one-hundred-
18 percent rate, and

19 b. residents hunting in big game or combination big game
20 and upland game commercial hunting areas.

21 F. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of
22 paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection E of this section, Five Dollars
23 (\$5.00) of the license fee shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land
24

1 Stamp and shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund
2 created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-141 of this title.

3 G. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to
4 require a hunting license, resident or nonresident, of any person
5 merely because the person participates, as owner or handler of an
6 entry, as an official, or as a spectator in the conduct of a field
7 trial or performance test of dogs, whether a resident or nonresident
8 of the State of Oklahoma. No license to hunt shall be required of
9 any person engaged in training or working dogs, provided that person
10 is in no way engaged in hunting and does not take or attempt to take
11 in any manner any game.

12 H. 1. Any person arrested for hunting game other than deer,
13 antelope, elk, bear or turkey without a valid hunting license as
14 required by the provisions of subsection A of this section may
15 purchase a substitute temporary thirty-day license from the
16 arresting game warden in lieu of posting bond. Proof of hunter
17 safety certification will not be required for the temporary
18 substitute license. The fee for a substitute license purchased
19 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall be:

- 20 a. for legal residents, Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and
- 21 b. for nonresidents, One Hundred Forty-five Dollars
22 (\$145.00).

23 2. Except as otherwise provided for by this subsection, the
24 fees from licenses purchased pursuant to the provisions of this

1 subsection shall be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund to
2 be used exclusively for developing, managing, preserving, and
3 protecting wildlife and wildlife habitat.

4 I. Any person producing proof in court that a current hunting
5 license issued by the Department of Wildlife Conservation to that
6 person was in force at the time of the alleged offense shall be
7 entitled to dismissal of a charge of violating this section upon
8 payment of court costs. If proof of a current hunting license
9 issued by the Department to the person that was in force at the time
10 of the alleged offense is presented to the court or district
11 attorney within seventy-two (72) hours after the violation, the
12 charge shall be dismissed without payment of court costs.

13 J. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for by
14 subsection H of this section, any resident convicted of violating
15 the provisions of this section shall be punished by the imposition
16 of a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more
17 than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), or by imprisonment in the county
18 jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both.

19 K. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for by
20 subsection H of this section, any nonresident convicted of violating
21 the provisions of this section shall be punished by the imposition
22 of a fine of not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more
23 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the
24 county jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both.

1 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2001, Section 4-114, as
2 last amended by Section 6, Chapter 317, O.S.L. 2010 (29 O.S. Supp.
3 2010, Section 4-114), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 4-114. A. All legal residents who have resided in the
5 state for at least six (6) months may purchase lifetime fishing
6 licenses, lifetime hunting licenses or lifetime combination hunting
7 and fishing licenses from the State Wildlife Conservation Director.

8 B. The fee for these licenses shall be:

9 1. Lifetime fishing license, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00);

10 2. Lifetime hunting license, Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00);

11 3. Lifetime combination hunting and fishing license, Seven
12 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00);

13 4. Senior citizen lifetime hunting license for persons sixty-
14 five (65) years of age or older, Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00);

15 5. Senior citizen lifetime fishing license for persons sixty-
16 five (65) years of age or older, Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00); and

17 6. Senior citizen lifetime combination hunting and fishing
18 license for persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older, Twenty-
19 five Dollars (\$25.00).

20 C. ~~Legal~~ A legal resident having proper certification from the
21 United States Department of Veterans Affairs or its successor
22 certifying that the person is a disabled veteran may purchase a
23 disability lifetime combination hunting and fishing license from the
24

1 State Wildlife Conservation Director. The fees for the license
2 shall be as follows:

3 1. Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for veterans having a
4 disability of less than sixty percent (60%); and

5 2. Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for veterans having a
6 disability of sixty percent (60%) or more.

7 D. A legal resident having proper certification that the person
8 is a firefighter or law enforcement officer with a disability of
9 sixty percent (60%) or more may purchase a disability lifetime
10 combination hunting and fishing license from the State Wildlife
11 Conservation Director for a fee of Three Hundred Twenty-five Dollars
12 (\$325.00).

13 E. The use of the licenses provided in this section are subject
14 to those restrictions provided by statute and the regulations of the
15 Wildlife Conservation Commission. Except as otherwise provided for
16 in this section, each lifetime hunting license issued pursuant to
17 subsections B and C of this section shall be in lieu of all annual
18 hunting licenses and all special season permits.

19 ~~F.~~ F. Should any lifetime license be lost or destroyed, a
20 duplicate will be issued by the Department of Wildlife Conservation
21 for a fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

22 ~~F.~~ G. A lifetime licensee shall not lose the privileges of such
23 license by a subsequent transfer of residency.

24

1 ~~G.~~ H. 1. In addition to the fees imposed pursuant to
2 paragraphs 1 through 3 of subsection B of this section, a person
3 purchasing a lifetime fishing, hunting or combination license,
4 excluding a senior citizen lifetime hunting, fishing or combination
5 hunting and fishing license issued pursuant to paragraphs 4 through
6 6 of subsection B of this section and a disability lifetime
7 combination hunting and fishing license issued pursuant to
8 subsection C of this section, shall be required to purchase a
9 Lifetime Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp. Each person shall have the
10 stamp in their possession while hunting, fishing, or taking any
11 wildlife. The fee for the Lifetime Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp

14 a. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) from each stamp shall be
15 deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund, created

17 the obligations and related expenses as authorized
18 pursuant to Section 168.9 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma
19 Statutes or to purchase, lease, or purchase easements
20 on real property to be used as public hunting,
21 fishing, and trapping areas, and

22 b. Five Dollars (\$5.00) from each stamp shall be
23 deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund, created
24 in Section 4-141 of this title, to be used by the

1 Commission for management of the real property
2 acquired pursuant to Section 168.9 of Title 73 of the
3 Oklahoma Statutes or acquired with proceeds from the
4 Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp fee.

5 2. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
6 prescribe, by rule, the form, design, and manner of issuance of the
7 Lifetime Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp.

8 3. Within one (1) year of the final retirement, redemption, or
9 defeasance of the obligations created pursuant to Section 168.9 of
10 Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Lifetime Oklahoma Wildlife
11 Land Stamp and Lifetime Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp fee
12 requirements provided for in this subsection shall terminate.

13 ~~H.~~ I. A person who is sixty-four (64) years of age shall be
14 eligible to purchase a senior citizen lifetime license issued
15 pursuant to paragraphs 4 through 6 of subsection B of this section
16 during the calendar year in which the person turns sixty-five (65)
17 years of age.

18 ~~I.~~ J. The fee for a lifetime fishing license, a lifetime
19 hunting license, or a lifetime combination hunting and fishing
20 license issued pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 3 of subsection B of
21 this section for a legal resident under eighteen (18) years of age
22 may be paid for by installments not to exceed a three-year period of
23 time and in a manner determined by the Director. The lifetime
24 license shall not be issued and become valid until full payment is

1 received by the Department of Wildlife Conservation. If the entire
2 amount of the license fee is not received within three (3) years
3 from the date the application for installment payments is submitted
4 to the Department, all funds received shall be forfeited and shall
5 not be refunded.

6 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2011.
