

# HOUSE JOURNAL

**First Regular Session of the Fifty-third Legislature**

**of the State of Oklahoma**

**Fifth Legislative Day, Tuesday, February 15, 2011**

The House was called to order by Speaker Steele.

The roll was called with 101 Members present.

The Speaker declared a quorum present.

**RESOLUTION FOR CONSIDERATION**

**SCR 4** was called up for consideration.

Representative Reynolds moved to amend **SCR 4**, Page 4, Lines 5-8 by deleting the language and replacing it with the following language:

“Neither chamber of the Oklahoma Legislature shall consider legislation unless said legislation has been made available to the members of the chamber then having custody of the measure at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to consideration.”
