Davis Memorial Commission, the Department of Labor, the Department of Mines, the Scenic Rivers Commission, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Water Resources Board, the Will Rogers Memorial Commission, the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission, the Department of Corrections, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training, the Board of Medicolegal Investigations, the Oklahoma State

Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Department of Public Safety, the Office of the Attorney General, the Court of Criminal Appeals, district attorneys and the District Attorneys Council, the Supreme Court, the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System, the Council on Judicial Complaints, the Pardon and Parole Board and the Workers' Compensation Court; stating amounts of the appropriations; stating purposes and restrictions; authorizing and requiring certain expenditures; authorizing and requiring certain transfers; requiring certain deposit; and providing an effective date.

HB 2171 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to transportation finance; amending Section 2, Chapter 285, O.S.L. 2008, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 444, O.S.L. 2010 (73 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 341), which relates to the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority; modifying amount of authorized proceeds; providing for additional authorization for certain proceeds; modifying reference to certain construction work plan; making reference to certain Appendix; incorporating content of Appendix by reference; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2172 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to state-tribal relations; providing for the transfer of all powers, duties, function and responsibilities of the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission to the Oklahoma Native American Liaison; describing what is included in the transfer; defining the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission; requiring execution of certain conveyances and documents by a certain date; providing for the transfer of certain monies and funds; providing for the succession of certain rights and responsibilities; recognizing the importance of cooperation between the state and Indian tribes; creating the position of Oklahoma Native American Liaison; providing for appointment by the Governor; providing for service as a certain cabinet position; requiring the first appointment by a certain date; requiring the Liaison to have certain percentage of American Indian blood; providing for budgeting of salary and expenses; requiring the Governor to provide certain support; establishing the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Liaison; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 1221, as last amended by Section 164, Chapter 234, O.S.L. 2009 (74 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 1221), which relates to cooperation and cooperative agreements with Indian Tribes; authorizing the Governor to name the Oklahoma Native American Liaison as designee for certain purposes; requiring the filing of copies of certain agreements with the Office of Tribal Relations; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 1226.2, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 146, O.S.L. 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 1226.2), which relates to the Native American Cultural and Educational Authority; modifying ex officio membership; repealing 74 O.S. 2001, Section 840-5.22, which relates to offices, positions and personnel of the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission; repealing 74 O.S. 2001, Sections 1201, 1202, 1203 and 1205, which relate to the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2173 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Office of the Attorney General; Amending 56 O.S. 2001, Section 1003, which relates to the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit; authorizing the Attorney General to recover certain funds wrongfully paid by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority; specifying how recovered funds shall be deposited; limiting balance in revolving fund to

certain percentage of current-year budget; requiring certain percentages of excess funds to be deposited in certain revolving funds; creating the Attorney General's Medicaid Fraud Revolving Fund; specifying type of fund; appropriating monies credited to the fund for certain activities; providing for the expenditure of funds; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2174 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Supreme Court; amending Section 9, Chapter 443, O.S.L. 2004 (20 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 1310.2), which relates to the State Judicial Revolving Fund; providing authorization to use funds for specified purposes; deleting certain transfer requirement; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2175 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System; amending 22 O.S. 2001, Sections 1355.2 and 1355.6, which relate to the Indigent Defense Act; providing definition; modifying scope of responsibilities of the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System; authorizing court to appoint legal representation for persons not in custody; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2176 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Department of Public Safety; creating the Department of Public Safety Restricted Revolving Fund; specifying type of fund; appropriating monies credited to the fund for specific purposes; requiring transfer of certain funds; creating the Department of Public Safety Patrol Academy Revolving Fund; specifying type of fund; appropriating monies credited to the fund for specific purposes; providing for the expenditure of funds; providing for codification; providing effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2177 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to voluntary buy out agreements; amending Section 2, Chapter 179, O.S.L. 2010 (74 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 84-2.28A), which relates to reimbursements for certain voluntary buy out agreements; modifying date reference; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2178 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Physician Manpower Training Commission; amending 70 O.S. 2001, Section 697.7, which relates to the Hospital Residency Revolving Fund; deleting authorization for certain hospital agreements; modifying source of payments to the Fund; modifying name of the Fund; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2179 – By Sears and Martin (Scott) of the House and Myers and Jolley of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Water Resources Board; amending 82 O.S. 2001, Section 1085.7, which relates to the Water Resources Board Revolving Fund; modifying name of fund; creating the OWRB Revolving Fund; providing for certain transfers; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
