“No intermediate revocation facility shall be located within one (1) mile of any public or private school site, educational institution, property or campsite used by an organization whose primary purpose is working with children, a playground or park that is established, operated or supported in whole or in part by a city, county, state, federal or tribal government, a residential housing addition, or licensed child care center, as defined by the Department of Human Services. The distance indicated in this section shall be measured from the nearest property line of the public or private school site, educational institution, property or campsite used by an organization whose primary purpose is working with children, playground, park, residential housing addition, or licensed child care center to the nearest property line of the intermediate revocation facility.”
