**Research Analysis**

The introduced version of HB 1320 amends the definition of tattooing to include applying henna/mehndi to the skin. Henna/mehndi refers to the leaves of a certain plant used to dye the skin. The definition relates to the provision that prohibits tattooing on a child under eighteen years of age or on a person impaired by drugs or alcohol.
