**Research Analysis**

The measure allows the State Board of Health to establish a schedule of family cost-participation fees for early intervention services. The fees must not include services to be provided for free to families according to the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. The fees may be based upon a sliding scale that includes adjusted gross income, family size, financial hardship and Medicaid eligibility. No fee will be established for any family making less than or equal to 185 percent of the federal poverty guidelines in adjusted gross income. Fees collected will be used to cover costs associated with the services.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The State Department of Health estimates the sliding fee schedule to generate \$801,171 annually, based on current SoonerStart service recipients' projected income, family size, and U.S. Census Bureau figures. Eliminating language referring to management and indirect costs will not impact the state, but may impact the State Departments of Health and Education, depending on terms of future service contracts.
