**Research Analysis**

The measure instructs the State Board of Education to develop a new way to distribute federal funding for high-needs students who have Individualized Education Programs. The department must divide the funds evenly between students placed in out-of-state residential institutions and students in Oklahoma public schools when the costs associated with those in-state students are at least three times the average per pupil expenditure of the state and the total excessive costs of all high-needs students in that district are at least 10 percent of the district's flow through allocation.
