**Research Analysis**

Floor amendment 1 to SB11 designates the portion of State Highway 19 in Grady county extending from the intersection of State Highway 19 and State Highway 81 east to the Little Washita River Bridge as the “Chief Warrant Officer Gordon Spangler Memorial Highway” and provides for permanent markers to be placed upon the highway bearing that name.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The Department of Transportation estimates the cost of providing adequate signage for a named road or bridge to range from between \$400 and \$1,700, depending on the necessary size. Annual maintenance may reach \$87.00 to \$106.00.
