**Research Analysis**

FA1 to SB 1272 requires the Director of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control to provide written notification to a practitioner (physician, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, physician assistant, scientific investigator, or other person permitted to prescribe controlled substances) when the OBNDD determines that a practitioner is prescribing a controlled dangerous substance to a person that has sought to fill or refill multiple prescriptions for controlled dangerous substances.

**Fiscal Analysis**

FA1 to SB1272 requires the Director of the Bureau of Narcotics (OBNDD) to alert practitioners when they believe a person may be unlawfully obtaining prescription drugs. According to OBNDD, this mandate will cost the agency approximately \$145,000 annually. The new costs include FTEs, programming, supplies, printing and postage. OBNDD has agreed to implement the mandate to the best of their ability without additional appropriations.
