**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute prohibits any state entity other than the Information Services Division of the Office of State Finance, institutions within the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education or OneNet from owning, leasing, or lease-purchasing any telecommunications fiber networks. Requires the Chief Information Officer to publish an information technology services cost-performance assessment subject to the approval of the State Governmental Technology Applications Review Board. The assessment must document the cost for each appropriated state agency's information and technology services and agency savings resulting from the consolidation of information technology assets within the Information Services Division of the Office of State Finance. Agencies not experiencing cost savings may have their information technology assets deconsolidated. Requires consolidations of information technology assets to maintain or increase security standards. Provides that consolidation of information technology assets are not to occur if it is determined that the asset is agency-specific applications, the consolidation would not result in a cost savings or if the proposed consolidation includes information technology assets of a state agency which is not subject to annual appropriations. Requires the State Governmental Technology Applications Review Board to function in conjunction with the Oklahoma Integrated Justice Information Systems Steering Committee to make recommendations to state office holders and agency officials related to continuity of criminal justice information system security protocols. Provides that consolidation is to occur according to a schedule established by the State Governmental Technology Applications Review Board. Requires the Chief Information Officer to develop and maintain an online web presence at "projects.ok.gov" to allow the public to monitor the status of every technology project costing \$100,000 or more. Requires that one of the gubernatorial appointments to the State Governmental Technology Applications Review Board be employed by a law enforcement agency. Modifies the duties of the Oklahoma Integrated Justice Information Systems Steering Committee to include advising the Chief Information Officer and the State Governmental Technology Applications Review Board.
