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8 An Act relating to missing and endangered persons;
9 requiring the Commissioner of Public Safety to
10 establish certain policies and procedures for certain
11 high-risk missing person advisory; defining term;
12 providing certain circumstances for determining such
13 persons; providing for codification; and declaring an
14 emergency.

16 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill
17 and insert

18 "An Act relating to missing and endangered persons;
19 providing short title; creating the JaRay Wilson
20 Missing Endangered Juveniles Act; amending 70 O.S.
21 2011, Section 3311.5, which relates to law
22 enforcement training and certification; requiring
23 education and training on response and notification
24 procedures for missing endangered juveniles;
providing for noncodification; and declaring an
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
2 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

3 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "JaRay Wilson
4 Missing Endangered Juveniles Act".

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3311.5, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 3311.5 A. On and after November 1, 2007, the Council
8 on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET), pursuant to its
9 authority granted by Section 3311 of this title, shall include in
10 its required basic training courses for law enforcement
11 certification a minimum of four (4) hours of education and training
12 relating to recognizing and managing a person appearing to require
13 mental health treatment or services. The Council shall further
14 offer a minimum of four (4) hours of education and training on
15 specific mental health issues pursuant to Section 3311.4 of this
16 title to meet the annual requirement for continuing education in the
17 areas of mental health issues.

18 B. By January 1, 2008, CLEET, pursuant to its authority granted
19 by Sections 3311 and 3311.4 of this title, shall include in its
20 required courses of study for law enforcement certification a
21 minimum of six (6) hours of evidence-based sexual assault and sexual
22 violence training. A portion of the sexual assault and sexual
23 violence training shall include instruction presented by a certified
24 sexual assault service provider.

1 C. By January 1, 2012, every active full-time peace officer,
2 previously certified by CLEET pursuant to Section 3311 of this
3 title, shall be required to attend and complete the evidence-based
4 sexual assault and sexual violence training provided in subsection B
5 of this section.

6 D. CLEET shall promulgate rules to enforce the provisions of
7 subsections B and C of this section and shall, with the assistance
8 of certified sexual assault service providers, establish a
9 comprehensive integrated curriculum for the teaching of evidence-
10 based sexual assault and sexual violence issues.

11 E. The Council is required to update that block of training or
12 course materials relating to legal issues, concepts, and state laws
13 annually, but not later than ninety (90) days following the
14 adjournment of any legislative session.

15 F. By January 1, 2009, CLEET, pursuant to its authority granted
16 by Sections 3311 and 3311.4 of this title, shall include in its
17 required courses of study for law enforcement certification a
18 minimum of four (4) hours of oil field equipment theft training.

19 G. By January 1, 2012, CLEET, pursuant to its authority granted
20 by Sections 3311 and 3311.4 of this title, shall establish and
21 include in its required courses of study for law enforcement
22 certification a minimum of eight (8) hours of evidence-based
23 domestic violence and stalking investigation training. The training
24 should include, at a minimum, the importance of reporting domestic

1 violence incidents, determining the predominant aggressor, evidence-
2 based investigation of domestic violence and stalking, and lethality
3 assessment. A portion of the training shall include instruction
4 presented by an expert victim advocate selected from recommendations
5 provided by the Office of the Attorney General or the Oklahoma
6 Domestic Violence Fatality Review Board. The training shall be
7 developed in collaboration with the Domestic Violence Fatality
8 Review Board, and where applicable, shall replace existing domestic
9 violence and stalking courses currently required.

10 H. By January 1, 2012, the evidence-based domestic violence and
11 stalking investigation curriculum developed in collaboration with
12 the Domestic Violence Fatality Review Board shall be submitted to
13 the Council for approval.

14 I. CLEET shall establish the training provided in subsection G
15 of this section as a part of CLEET's peace officer continuing
16 education program and develop a plan to train full-time peace
17 officers previously certified by CLEET pursuant to Section 3311 of
18 this title where applicable. The Office of the Attorney General
19 shall provide a list of expert victim advocates that are available
20 to assist in the training.

21 J. On and after November 1, 2013, CLEET, pursuant to its
22 authority granted by Section 3311 of this title, shall include in
23 its required basic training courses for law enforcement
24 certification education and training relating to initial-response

1 protocols and notification procedures when receiving reports of
2 missing endangered juveniles.

3 K. The Council is authorized to pay for and send training staff
4 and employees to one or more training and education courses in
5 jurisdictions outside this state for the purpose of expanding
6 curriculum, training skill development, and general knowledge within
7 the field of law enforcement education and training.

8 ~~K.~~ L. The Council shall promulgate rules to evaluate and
9 approve municipalities and counties that are deemed capable of
10 conducting separate basic law enforcement training academies in
11 their jurisdiction and to certify officers successfully completing
12 such academy training courses. Upon application to the Council, any
13 municipality with a population of sixty-five thousand (65,000) or
14 more or any county with a population of five hundred thousand
15 (500,000) or more shall be authorized to operate a basic law
16 enforcement academy. The Council shall approve an application when
17 the municipality or county making the application meets the criteria
18 for a separate training academy and demonstrates to the satisfaction
19 of the Council that the academy has sufficient resources to conduct
20 the training, the instructional staff is appropriately trained and
21 qualified to teach the course materials, the curriculum is composed
22 of comparable or higher quality course segments to the CLEET academy
23 curriculum, and the facilities where the academy will be conducted
24 are safe and sufficient for law enforcement training purposes. Any

1 municipality or county authorized to operate a basic law enforcement
2 academy after November 1, 2007, shall not be eligible to receive
3 funds pursuant to subsection E of Section 1313.2 of Title 20 of the
4 Oklahoma Statutes. The Council shall not provide any funding for
5 the operation of any separate training academy authorized by this
6 subsection.

7 E. M. Any municipality or county that, prior to November 1,
8 2007, was authorized to conduct a basic law enforcement academy
9 shall continue to receive funding pursuant to subsection E of
10 Section 1313.2 of Title 20 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

11 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
12 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
13 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
14 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
