9 An Act relating to public finance; creating the
10 Transparency, Accountability and Innovation in
11 Oklahoma State Government 2.0 Act of 2013; amending
12 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.11.2, which relates to the
13 Oklahoma State Government 2.0 initiative; providing
14 for data sets; removing convenience information sets;
15 requiring data sets be made available for public
16 access; requiring listing of individuals and
17 employers required to file certain reports be
18 available on certain portal; providing for
19 noncodification; providing for codification; and
20 providing an effective date.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
23 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

24 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Transparency,
Accountability and Innovation in Oklahoma State Government 2.0 Act
of 2013".

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.11.2, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 34.11.2 A. There is hereby established the Oklahoma
4 State Government 2.0 Initiative.

5 B. The State Governmental Technology Applications Review Board
6 shall consider and approve a standardized social media policy for
7 use by state agencies, boards, commissions and public trusts having
8 the State of Oklahoma as a beneficiary.

9 C. The board shall establish open technology standards and a
10 schedule by which state agencies, boards, commissions and public
11 trusts having the State of Oklahoma as a beneficiary shall utilize
12 these standards to provide citizens with web-based interactivity to
13 state government services. Whenever possible these standards shall
14 match commonly used standards by other government entities.

15 D. The board shall set a schedule by which state agencies,
16 boards, commissions and public trusts having the State of Oklahoma
17 as a beneficiary shall publish and update convenience information
18 sets which shall be accessible through standardized application
19 programming interfaces and published in standardized formats
20 including but not limited to eXtensible Markup Language (XML) and
21 Comma Separated Value (CSV) formats. The board shall establish
22 application programming interface standards which enable access to
23 ~~convenience information~~ data sets. The schedule shall place an
24 emphasis on first making accessible ~~convenience information~~ data

1 sets most commonly requested in open records requests. A directory
2 and link to all available ~~convenience information~~ data sets shall be
3 prominently featured on the portal system referenced in Section
4 34.24 of this title and ~~if possible linked to~~ made available through
5 the *data.ok.gov* web portal.

6 E. The board may conduct events and contests to provide
7 recognition of software application development provided that the
8 application being recognized utilizes standards established in this
9 section to the benefit of the citizens of Oklahoma.

10 F. The board shall establish an application process through
11 which applicants can request the scheduled implementation of
12 application programming interfaces, creation of open technology
13 standards and publication of ~~convenience information~~ data sets
14 pursuant to the provisions of this section. Instructions regarding
15 the application process shall be prominently featured on the portal
16 system referenced in Section 34.24 of this title.

17 G. State agencies, boards, commissions and public trusts having
18 the State of Oklahoma as a beneficiary shall comply with the
19 policies, schedules and standards established by this section.

20 H. The board shall implement standardized policies by which
21 state agencies may accept terms of service related to liability
22 issues for the usage of social media services, contracts for
23 technology products and technology service contracts provided the
24 liability clause in the terms of service or contract contains

1 standard language including a liability agreement which is
2 considered customary or largely similar to terms of service agreed
3 to or contracts entered into by other government entities and
4 private sector enterprises.

5 I. The board shall promulgate performance metrics and
6 guidelines which shall be used to establish criteria which govern
7 participation in the "State Government Employee Performance
8 Transparency Pilot Program". The board shall set a schedule for the
9 *data.ok.gov* website.

10 J. For the purposes of this section, "open technology
11 standards" are widely accepted standards and mechanisms for the web-
12 based connectivity and asynchronous communication between software
13 programs. "Application programming interface" is a standardized
14 interface enabling a standard form of connectivity between
15 convenience information sets and software programs, and "performance
16 information metrics" are sets of information which reflect the
17 performance of state employees and state agencies, ~~and "convenience~~
18 ~~information sets" are sets of information which are subject to~~
19 ~~public access under the Oklahoma Open Records Act and which do not~~
20 ~~contain personally identifiable information.~~

21 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.11.2.1 of Title 62, unless
23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1 A. The Chief Information Officer shall cause the following data
2 sets to be made available for public access through the *data.ok.gov*
3 portal:

4 1. A month-to-month accounting of each fund and account in which
5 state moneys are kept. This data set shall include the name of the
6 fund, state agency which utilizes the fund and the amount of
7 expenditures from the fund occurring in each month.

8 2. A listing of exception requests from mandatory statewide
9 purchasing contracts, disposition of each exception request, state
10 agency requesting the exception and identification of the contract
11 and specific item for which the exception was requested;

12 3. A list of total monthly expenditures by each state agency;
13 and

14 4. Other items as may be required by state law.

15 B. The *data.ok.gov* portal shall feature a complete listing of
16 individuals and their principal employers required to file reports
17 with the state pursuant to Section 257:23-1-2 of Title 74 of the
18 Oklahoma Statutes.

19 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
