11 An Act relating to carrying of firearms; amending 19  
12 O.S. 2011, Section 215.29, which relates to the  
13 carrying of firearms by district attorneys; adding  
14 certain persons who may carry a firearm; clarifying  
15 language; and providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 215.29, is  
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 215.29 A. A district attorney, ~~or~~ a retired district  
20 attorney who receives a statement from the appropriate retirement  
21 system verifying the status of the person as a retired district  
22 attorney, a district attorney who does not seek reelection or has  
23 been defeated in a reelection vote, or the Attorney General may  
24 carry a firearm on his or her person anywhere in the state to use

1 only for personal protection if the person has successfully  
2 completed an approved course of ~~firearm~~ firearms training conducted  
3 by a state-certified firearms instructor which meets the minimum  
4 requirements for firearms training as set forth by the Council on  
5 Law Enforcement Education and Training.

6 B. ~~At the discretion of the district attorney, the~~ The district  
7 attorney may allow an assistant district attorney and the Attorney  
8 General may allow an assistant attorney general to carry a firearm  
9 on his or her person anywhere in the state to use only for personal  
10 protection if the person has successfully completed an approved  
11 course of ~~firearm~~ firearms training conducted by a state-certified  
12 firearms instructor which meets the minimum requirements for  
13 firearms training as set forth by the Council on Law Enforcement  
14 Education and Training.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
