7	An Act relating to tax rebates; providing short title; creating the Quality Workforce Act; defining					
8	terms; limiting total rebate payments; authorizing the payment of rebates by the Oklahoma Tax Commission					
9	subject to approval by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce for qualified workforce investment;					
10	providing for the manner in which rebate payments shall be made; establishing procedures related to					
11	rebate payments; establishing requirements which must be met before specified application is approved;					
12	establishing procedures related to the program; providing for the existence of a specified agreement					
13	once an application is approved; creating the Quality Workforce Rebate Payment Fund and providing for the					
14	deposit of monies into, and the use and expenditure of, contents of the fund; limiting the liability of					
15	the Quality Workforce Rebate Payment Fund to fund balance; providing for promulgation of rules by					
16	specified agencies; providing penalty; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.					
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:					
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified					
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3921 of Title 68, unless there					
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:					
23	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Quality					
24	Workforce Act".					

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1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3922 of Title 68, unless there 2 3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: As used in the Quality Workforce Act: 4 5 1. "Approved certificate or degree" means a program of education located in Oklahoma and approved by the Oklahoma 6 Department of Commerce prior to the time the establishment makes an 7 initial application, which will result in the granting of an 8 9 associate degree by an accredited public or private institution of 10 higher education or an industrial or vocational licensing or 11 certification program; "Basic industry" means any industry which meets the criteria 12 2. set provided pursuant to paragraph 1 of Section 3913 of Title 68 of 13 the Oklahoma Statutes; 14 "Critical occupation" means an occupation identified by the 15 3. Oklahoma Department of Commerce as a critical industry certification 16 which meets the guidelines of the identified core competencies of 17 the state based on wealth generation, growth potential and 18 competitive advantage; and 19 "Eligible employee" means an individual who is a resident of 20 4. this state and is a full time employee of the establishment making 21 application for a rebate, who is serving in a position or function 22 which qualifies as a critical occupation, and for whom the 23 establishment has paid the cost of tuition and materials necessary 24

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1 to obtain an approved license, certificate or degree during or prior 2 to full time employment;

5. "Establishment" means any for profit business, no matter what legal form, including, but not limited to, a sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, or limited liability corporation;

6. "Full-time employment" means employment of persons residing in this state and working for thirty (30) hours per week or more in this state, which has a minimum six-month duration during any twelve-month period;

11 7. "Rebate" means a payment to an establishment for one hundred 12 five percent (105%) of the amount of tuition and materials paid on 13 behalf of an eligible employee for an approved license, certificate 14 or degree;

8. "Rebate supplement" means:

a. if applicable, an amount equal to five percent (5%) of
the amount of any tuition and materials paid on behalf
of an eligible employee who is a veteran of the Armed
Forces of the United States; and

b. if applicable, an amount equal to five percent (5%) of
the amount of any tuition and materials paid on behalf
of an eligible employee who was, or whose household
was, enrolled in the Oklahoma Medicaid program at the

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time of matriculation into an approved license, certificate or degree program.

3 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3923 of Title 68, unless there 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. An eligible establishment which receives approval by the 6 Oklahoma Department of Commerce pursuant to the provisions of the 7 Quality Workforce Act may receive a rebate from the Oklahoma Tax 8 9 Commission equal to amounts paid for workforce investment for 10 eligible employees plus any rebate supplement. Such payments shall 11 be made until fully reimbursed but annual payments shall be limited 12 to an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the average wage of all employees of the establishment multiplied by the number of eligible 13 employees. 14

B. In order to receive rebate payments, an establishment shall apply to, and be approved by, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce on forms prescribed by the Department.

18 C. Before approving the application for rebate payments, the19 Department shall establish that the establishment applying:

Is eligible subject to the applicable definitions provided
 in Section 2 of this act;

22 2. Is not currently participating or applying to participate in23 the Oklahoma Quality Jobs Program Act, the Saving Quality Jobs Act,

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the Former Military Facility Development Act, the Small Employer
 Quality Jobs Act or the 21st Century Quality Jobs Incentive Act;

3 3. Has a basic health benefit plan which, as determined by the
4 Department, meets the requirements of divisions (1) through (7) of
5 subparagraph b of paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 3603 of
6 Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes and which has been offered or will
7 be offered to individuals within twelve (12) months of employment;

8 4. Has obtained the applicable approval of the certificate or
9 degree program prior to the matriculation of an employee or
10 potential employee; and

11 5. Has documentation of direct payment to an institution for12 the completion of an approved license, certificate or degree.

Upon a determination that an applicant is qualified pursuant 13 D. to subsection C of this section, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce 14 shall notify the Oklahoma Tax Commission and provide it with a copy 15 of the application and approval. Such approval shall include, but 16 not be limited to, the approved license, certificate or degree 17 program, the name of the eligible employee and the critical 18 occupation identified. The Tax Commission may require the 19 establishment to submit additional information as may be necessary 20 to administer the provisions of this act. Eligible establishments 21 may be audited by the Oklahoma Tax Commission to verify eligibility 22 for rebate payments. Once the application is approved, an agreement 23 shall be deemed to exist between the establishment and the State of 24

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Oklahoma requiring rebate payments to be made for as long as the
 establishment retains eligibility, within the limitations of this
 act as it exists at the time of such approval.

4 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3924 of Title 68, unless there 6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created within the State Treasury a special fund 7 for the Oklahoma Tax Commission to be designated the "Quality 8 9 Workforce Rebate Payment Fund". The Tax Commission is hereby 10 authorized and directed to withhold a portion of the taxes levied and collected pursuant to Section 2355 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma 11 12 Statutes for deposit into the fund. The amount deposited shall equal the sum estimated by the Tax Commission to be sufficient to 13 pay rebate payments claimed pursuant to the provisions of Section 3 14 15 of this act. All of the amounts deposited in such fund shall be used and expended by the Tax Commission solely for the purposes and 16 in the amounts authorized by the Quality Workforce Act. 17 The liability of the State of Oklahoma to make rebate payments under the 18 Quality Workforce Act shall be limited to the balance contained in 19 the fund created by this section. 20

21 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3925 of Title 68, unless there 23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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The Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Oklahoma Tax
 Commission shall promulgate rules necessary to implement their
 respective duties and responsibilities under the provisions of the
 Quality Workforce Act.

5 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3926 of Title 68, unless there 7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person making an application, claim for payment or any 8 9 report, return, statement, invoice, or other instrument or providing 10 any other information pursuant to the provisions of this act who 11 willfully makes a false or fraudulent application, claim, report, 12 return, statement, invoice, or other instrument, or who willfully provides any false or fraudulent information, or any person who 13 willfully aids or abets another in making such false or fraudulent 14 15 application, claim, report, return, statement, invoice, or other instrument, or who willfully aids or abets another in providing any 16 17 false or fraudulent information, upon conviction, shall be quilty of a misdemeanor. The fine for a violation of this provision shall not 18 be less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than Fifty 19 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Any person convicted of a violation 20 of this section shall be liable for the repayment of all rebate 21 payments which were paid to the establishment. Interest shall be 22 due on such payments at the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum. 23
