9 An Act relating to chiropractic procedures; creating
10 the Task Force on Chiropractic Procedures;
11 designating membership and appointing authorities;
12 providing date by which appointments shall be made;
13 specifying terms of service; providing for filling
14 vacancies; providing frequency of meetings; providing
15 for a quorum; providing travel reimbursements to task
16 force members; designating agency staff; providing
17 for noncodification; providing an effective date; and
18 declaring an emergency.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
21 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

22 There is hereby created, to continue until December 31, 2013, in
23 accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, a Task
24 Force on Chiropractic Procedures.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

1 A. There is hereby created a nine (9) member Task Force on
2 Chiropractic Procedures. The membership of the task force shall be
3 as follows:

4 1. The President of the Oklahoma State Board of Chiropractic
5 Examiners, or a designee;

6 2. Two representatives from the chiropractic medicine industry,
7 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of
8 the House of Representatives, respectively;

9 3. Two Senators, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
10 Senate;

11 4. Two Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House
12 of Representatives;

13 5. A representative from the Oklahoma State Medical
14 Association; and

15 6. A representative from the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association.

16 B. Appointments to the task force shall be made by August 1,
17 2013. Members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing
18 authority. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the
19 original appointing authority.

20 C. The task force may meet monthly and at other such times as
21 deemed necessary by members. A majority of members present at a
22 meeting shall constitute a quorum to transact business and a
23 majority present may act for the task force.

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1 D. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation for
2 their service, but shall be reimbursed for their actual and
3 necessary travel expenses as follows:

4 1. Nonlegislative members who are state officers or employees
5 shall be reimbursed by their respective agencies for their necessary
6 travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
7 accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement
8 Act;

9 2. Members who are not legislators or officers or employees of
10 the state shall be reimbursed by their appointing authorities in
11 accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement
12 Act; and

13 3. Legislative members shall be reimbursed for their necessary
14 travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
15 accordance with Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

16 E. The Task Force on Chiropractic Procedures shall examine
17 risks associated with treatment of the cervical spine and explore
18 methods to inform patients of possible side effects resulting from
19 certain treatments.

20 F. The Senate shall provide staff assistance to the Task Force
21 on Chiropractic Procedures.

22 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

23 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
24 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
