12 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.  
13 2011, Section 3601.2, as amended by Section 1007,  
14 Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section  
15 3601.2), which relates to salaries for chief  
16 executive officers; modifying provisions related to  
17 salary amounts; requiring salaries to be set between  
18 certain minimum and maximum amounts; providing for  
19 reference to annual compensation reports; requiring  
20 recommendations by Office of Management and  
21 Enterprise Services; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section  
22 150.6a, which relates to salaries for certain  
23 positions with the Oklahoma State Bureau of  
24 Investigation; modifying provision related to salary  
of the Director; providing an effective date; and  
declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as  
2 amended by Section 1007, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp.  
3 2012, Section 3601.2), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 3601.2 A. Beginning ~~January 1, 2010~~ July 1, 2013, the  
5 each agency, board, commission, department or program in the  
6 executive branch of state government shall establish the salary of  
7 each of the chief executive officers for which they have appointing  
8 authority. Such salary shall be set between the minimum and maximum  
9 of the range specified ~~below~~ in the annual compensation reports  
10 required by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of this title, for full-  
11 time employees only, ~~per annum, payable monthly, pursuant to the~~  
12 ~~limitations outlined below:~~

13 ~~1. If the chief executive officer's salary is below the minimum~~  
14 ~~annual salary then it can not be raised to more than the minimum~~  
15 ~~annual salary in one (1) fiscal year. If the chief executive~~  
16 ~~officer's salary is at or above the minimum annual salary then the~~  
17 ~~salary may not be increased above the midpoint in one (1) fiscal~~  
18 ~~year.~~

19 ~~2. Such increases shall not occur more than once in a fiscal~~  
20 ~~year; and~~

21 ~~3. The salary of the incumbent chief executive officer shall~~  
22 ~~not be increased if the officer's salary exceeds the maximum of the~~  
23 ~~range.~~

7       B. All increases require certification of the appointing  
8 authority that said action can be implemented for the current fiscal  
9 year and subsequent fiscal year without the need for additional  
10 funding. The agency, board, commission, department or program shall  
11 report increases granted under this section to the Office of  
12 Management and Enterprise Services on an annual basis by August 1 of  
13 each year. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall  
14 forward a report of such increases to the Governor, President Pro  
15 Tempore of the Senate, and Speaker of the House of Representatives  
16 no later than September 1 of each year.

17       C. Every ~~two (2) years starting FY-05~~ three (3) years beginning  
18 with fiscal year 2013, the Office of Management and Enterprise  
19 Services shall review these salary ranges and report on and make  
20 recommendations on proposed salary ranges in ~~their~~ its annual

23 ~~December 1~~ February 1 for chief executive officers in all state

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, is  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 150.6a A. Effective July 1, 2004, the annual salaries  
8 for the Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State  
9 Bureau of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in  
10 accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule,  
11 exclusive of longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this  
12 title:

13 1. Deputy Director:

14 The salary of the Deputy Director shall be  
15 ninety-five percent (95%) of that received  
16 by the Director;

17 2. Division Director:

18 The salary of a Division Director shall be  
19 ninety percent (90%) of that received by

16 C. Effective January 1, ~~2007~~ 2013, the annual salaries for the  
17 Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau  
18 of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance  
19 and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of  
20 longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

3        SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

4        SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
5 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
6 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
7 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
