13 An Act relating to state employee compensation;
14 making legislative findings related to compensation;
15 making findings regarding state employee benefits;
16 providing for inapplicability to certain
17 modifications or implementation related to
18 retirement; providing for codification; and providing
19 an effective date.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-2.15A of Title 74, unless
23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 The state employee compensation program is designed to attract,
retain and reward quality employees with competitive total

1 compensation based on relevant labor markets. The compensation
2 program will establish pay structures with a goal of working toward
3 the recommendations of the 2013 State Employee Total Remuneration
4 Study. The compensation program will reinforce a productive work
5 climate and culture of accountability and make the State of Oklahoma
6 an employer of choice. Pay structures will be implemented with
7 fairness and equity. Pay delivery mechanisms will be based on a
8 combination of the achievement of performance objectives,
9 recognition of differences in job content, acquisition and
10 application of further skill and education. The Legislature will be
11 accountable for the funding of the pay structures established
12 pursuant to the compensation program.

13 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-1.6B of Title 74, unless
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 State employee benefits will not be reduced or realigned by
17 action or enactments of the Legislature until additional
18 appropriations of Sixty Million Dollars (\$60,000,000.00) or more are
19 approved for targeted pay raises based on the annual compensation
20 report described in paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of Title 74 of
21 the Oklahoma Statutes. The provisions of this section shall not
22 restrict modifications to an existing defined benefit plan or the
23 implementation of a new retirement system or plan for state
24 employees which is considered outside the scope of this section.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
