16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3601.3 of Title 74, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. The chief executive officer of any agency, board,  
21 commission, department or other state governmental entity organized  
22 within the executive branch of state government which does not  
23 receive appropriations from the Legislature and which is responsible  
24 for the licensing of professional persons may receive a salary which

1 is eighty percent (80%) to one hundred percent (100%) of the mean  
2 annual wage for the occupation licensed by the entity within the  
3 State of Oklahoma as determined by the United States Department of  
4 Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics or an appropriate salary as  
5 decided by the agency, board, commission, department or other state  
6 governmental entity upon approval of the applicable cabinet  
7 secretary.

8 B. The provisions of this section shall not be applicable to  
9 any agency, board, commission, department or other entity organized  
10 within the executive department of state government if such entity  
11 receives appropriations from the Legislature.

12 C. Except for the state governmental entities described in  
13 subsection A of this section, the Legislature shall prescribe  
14 maximum salary amounts for the chief executive officer of any state  
15 governmental entity organized within the executive branch of state  
16 government each fiscal year in one or more measures as part of the  
17 annual appropriations process.

18 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
19 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

20 The Legislature finds that the topic of state employee  
21 compensation is or will be made the subject of a remuneration study  
22 initiated by the Governor during the fiscal year ending June 30,  
23 2013, the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014, or both such fiscal  
24 years.

1 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
2 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

3 A. Effective November 1, 2013, each state employee in both the  
4 classified and the unclassified service who received a "meets  
5 standards" or better rating on his or her performance evaluation  
6 shall receive a performance payment of One Thousand Dollars  
7 (\$1,000.00) or the amount necessary to equal the difference between  
8 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and the amount of any market  
9 adjustment received by the employee during the periods of time  
10 described by subsection C of this section.

11 B. Of the amount specified in subsection A of this section,  
12 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) shall be paid specifically by the  
13 employing agency, board, commission, department or other state  
14 governmental entity from efficiencies and savings within the budget  
15 of the entity for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014.

16 C. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not be  
17 applicable with respect to an employee who has received a market  
18 adjustment in compensation of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or  
19 more during the fiscal years ending June 30, 2012, June 30, 2013, or  
20 for the period of time beginning July 1, 2013, but prior to November  
21 1, 2013.

22 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, is  
23 amended to read as follows:

1 Section 150.6a A. Effective July 1, 2004, the annual salaries  
2 for the Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State  
3 Bureau of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in  
4 accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule,  
5 exclusive of longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this  
6 title:

7 1. Deputy Director:

8 The salary of the Deputy Director shall be  
9 ninety-five percent (95%) of that received  
10 by the Director;

11 2. Division Director:

12 The salary of a Division Director shall be  
13 ninety percent (90%) of that received by  
14 the Director;

15 3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:

16 Minimum \$33,500.00, Mid-point \$41,875.00,  
17 Maximum \$50,250.00;

18 4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:

19 Minimum \$39,250.00, Mid-point \$49,062.00,  
20 Maximum \$58,875.00;

21 5. Agent III (OSBI), Criminalist III:

22 Minimum \$46,250.00, Mid-point \$57,812.00,  
23 Maximum \$69,375.00;

24 6. Agent IV (OSBI), Criminalist IV:

1 Minimum \$51,000.00, Mid-point \$63,750.00,  
2 Maximum \$76,500.00; and

3 7. Agent V (OSBI), Criminalist V:

4 Minimum \$56,000.00, Mid-point \$70,000.00,  
5 Maximum \$84,000.00.

6 B. Effective July 1, 2004, positions allocated to the agent and  
7 criminalist job families may receive additional compensation through  
8 the use of pay mechanisms provided for in the Oklahoma Personnel Act  
9 and the Merit System of Personnel Administration Rules.

10 C. Effective January 1, ~~2007~~ 2013, the annual salaries for the  
11 Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau  
12 of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance  
13 and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of  
14 longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

15 1. ~~Director: \$80,138.10;~~

16 ~~2.~~ Deputy Director:

17 The salary of the Deputy Director shall be ninety-five  
18 percent (95%) of that received by the Director;

19 ~~3.~~ 2. Division Director:

20 The salary of a Division Director shall be ninety percent  
21 (90%) of that received by the Director;

22 ~~4.~~ 3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:

23 Minimum \$40,778.00, Mid-point \$49,153.00,  
24 Maximum \$57,528.00;

~~5.~~ 4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:  
Minimum \$46,260.00, Mid-point \$56,072.00,  
Maximum \$65,885.00;

~~6.~~ 5. Agent III (OSBI), Criminalist III:  
Minimum \$51,980.00, Mid-point \$63,542.00,  
Maximum \$75,105.00;

~~7.~~ 6. Agent IV (OSBI), Criminalist IV:  
Minimum \$60,615.00, Mid-point \$73,365.00,  
Maximum \$86,115.00; and

~~8.~~ 7. Agent V (OSBI), Criminalist V:  
Minimum \$66,386.00, Mid-point \$80,386.00,  
Maximum \$94,386.00.

Provided, however, no such employee shall receive less than the salary the employee received on December 31, 2006.

SECTION 5. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as amended by Section 1007, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 3601.2), is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
