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8 An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011,
9 Section 3-151.1, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 83,
10 O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 3-151.1),
11 which relates to the adjusted cohort graduation rate;
12 modifying calculation of the four-year adjusted
13 cohort graduation rate; changing type of high school
14 diploma used to calculate graduation rate; providing
15 an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-151.1, as
18 amended by Section 5, Chapter 83, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2013,
19 Section 3-151.1), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 3-151.1 A. For purposes of establishing a uniform and
21 accurate definition of high school graduation rate for school
22 districts and secondary schools in the state, the State Board of
23 Education shall adopt and implement a four-year adjusted cohort
24 graduation rate and an extended-year adjusted cohort graduation
rate. The Board shall utilize and report the four-year adjusted
cohort graduation rate and the extended-year adjusted cohort

1 graduation rate at the secondary school site, the school district
2 and the state level, and the graduation rates shall be reported in
3 the aggregate as well as disaggregated by subgroups as required in
4 the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 2001 (ESEA), P.L. No.
5 107-110, also known as the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

6 B. The Board shall use the four-year adjusted cohort graduation
7 rate for purposes of determining the high school graduation rate
8 indicator for the academic performance data calculation beginning
9 with state and district report cards providing results of
10 assessments administered in the 2011-2012 school year. The Board
11 shall use the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate for
12 establishing the high school graduation rate for measuring alternate
13 year percentage growth targets as set forth in Section 3-151.2 of
14 this title beginning with the 2012-2013 school year.

15 C. The four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate shall be
16 defined as the number of students who graduate in four (4) years
17 with a standard high school diploma divided by the number of
18 students who entered high school four (4) years earlier, adjusted
19 for transfers in and out of the school, émigrés and deceased
20 students. Students who graduate in four (4) years shall include
21 students who earn a standard high school diploma at the end of their
22 fourth year, before the end of their fourth year, and during a
23 summer session immediately following their fourth year. To remove a
24 student from a cohort, a school district shall confirm in writing or

1 by electronic means that a student has transferred out of the school
2 site or school district, has emigrated to another country or is
3 deceased. For a student who transfers out of a school site or
4 school district, the written or electronic confirmation shall be
5 official and document that the student has enrolled in another
6 school site or school district or in an educational program that
7 culminates in a ~~standard~~ high school diploma recognized by a state
8 or private higher educational institution accredited or recognized
9 by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for purposes of
10 admission to the institution. Students ~~who graduate with not~~
11 enrolled in a program which culminates in the award of a credential
12 ~~other than a standard high school diploma or a higher diploma,~~
13 ~~including but not limited to a General Educational Development (GED)~~
14 ~~credential, certificate of attendance, or any alternative award,~~
15 recognized by a state or private higher educational institution for
16 purposes of admissions shall not be included in the graduation rate
17 calculation as set forth in this subsection as a student who
18 graduated in four (4) years with a standard high school diploma but
19 shall be included in the number of students who entered high school
20 four (4) years earlier.

21 D. The extended-year adjusted cohort graduation rate shall be
22 defined as the number of students who graduate in four (4) years or
23 five (5) years with a ~~standard~~ high school diploma divided by the
24 number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the four-year

1 graduation rate as calculated as provided for in subsection C of
2 this section, provided that the adjustments add to the cohort all
3 students who transfer into the cohort by the end of the year of
4 graduation being considered and subtract students who transfer out,
5 emigrate to another country or are deceased by the end of that year.
6 The extended-year adjusted cohort graduation rate shall be reported
7 separately from the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.

9 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
10 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
11 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
12 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
