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7 An Act relating to sunset; amending 62 O.S. 2011,
8 Section 34.30, as amended by Section 362, Chapter
9 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 34.30),
10 which relates to the Electronic and Information
11 Technology Accessibility Advisory Council; and re-
12 creating the Council.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.30, as
15 amended by Section 362, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62 O.S. Supp.
16 2013, Section 34.30), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 34.30 A. There is hereby re-created, to continue until
18 July 1, ~~2014~~ 2020, the Electronic and Information Technology
19 Accessibility Advisory Council. The Advisory Council shall study
20 and make recommendations concerning the accessibility for the
21 disabled to publicly produced and provided electronic and
22 information technology and to provide advice and assistance to the
23 Information Services Division of the Office of Management and
24 Enterprise Services on the development of accessibility standards

1 and complaint procedures as provided for in Section 34.28 of this
2 title.

3 B. The Advisory Council shall be composed of the following
4 members:

5 1. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by
6 the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

7 2. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro
8 Tempore of the Senate;

9 3. The Chief Information Officer, or a designee;

10 4. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
11 Services, or a designee;

12 5. The Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation
13 Services, or a designee;

14 6. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or a designee;

15 7. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and
16 Technology Education, or a designee;

17 8. The Director of the Library for the Blind and Physically
18 Handicapped with the State Department of Rehabilitation Services, or
19 a designee;

20 9. The Director of the Office of Disability Concerns, or a
21 designee;

22 10. A representative of OneNet, the state telecommunications
23 network within the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education;

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1 11. The Director for Oklahoma Able Tech, the state assistive
2 technology program located at Oklahoma State University;

3 12. A representative of state agency web managers appointed by
4 the Governor from a list submitted by a state agency web manager
5 group;

6 13. A representative of an association representing education
7 technology administrators appointed by the Speaker of the House of
8 Representatives;

9 14. A representative of an association of distance learning
10 education professionals appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
11 the Senate;

12 15. Two representatives of corporations or vendors of
13 information or electronic technology hardware or software who are
14 knowledgeable or have experience in the field of assistive
15 technology appointed by the Governor;

16 16. A representative of a corporation or vendor specializing in
17 assistive technology appointed by the Governor; and

18 17. Four representatives who are individuals with a disability,
19 one who is blind or visually impaired, one who is deaf or hard of
20 hearing, one with a mobility disability, and one with a cognitive
21 disability and all of whom are users of information or electronic
22 technology appointed by the Governor.

23 C. Members who were serving on the Electronic and Information
24 Technology Accessibility Task Force as of July 1, 2004, shall

1 automatically be appointed to serve on the Electronic and
2 Information Technology Accessibility Advisory Council after July 1,
3 2004.

4 D. The Advisory Council shall:

5 1. Make recommendation on action, including legislative action,
6 needed to ensure that all electronic and information technology
7 produced, procured, or developed by state agencies are accessible to
8 the disabled;

9 2. Identify disability accessibility standards that are
10 emerging or fully adopted by national standard organizations;

11 3. Review and make recommendations on disability accessibility
12 initiatives and legislation undertaken in other states; and

13 4. Provide advice and assistance to the Information Services
14 Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services on the
15 development of accessibility standards and complaint procedures as
16 provided for in Section 34.28 of this title.

17 E. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
18 President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each designate a cochair
19 from among the members of the Advisory Council.

20 F. A majority of the members of the Advisory Council shall
21 constitute a quorum. A majority of the members present at a meeting
22 may act for the Advisory Council.

23 G. Meetings of the Advisory Council shall be called by either
24 cochair.

1 H. Proceedings of all meetings of the Advisory Council shall
2 comply with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

3 I. The Advisory Council may divide into subcommittees in
4 furtherance of its purpose.

5 J. Staff of the Oklahoma Able Tech, the state assistive
6 technology program located at Oklahoma State University, shall serve
7 as primary staff for the Advisory Council. Appropriate personnel
8 from the Information Services Division shall also assist with the
9 work of the Advisory Council.

10 K. The Advisory Council may use the expertise and services of
11 the staffs of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and State Senate
12 and may, as necessary, seek the advice and services of experts in
13 the field as well as other necessary professional and clerical
14 staff.

15 L. All departments, officers, agencies, and employees of this
16 state shall cooperate with the Advisory Council in fulfilling its
17 duties and responsibilities including, but not limited to, providing
18 any information, records, or reports requested by the Advisory
19 Council.

20 M. Members of the Advisory Council shall receive no
21 compensation for their service, but shall receive travel
22 reimbursement as follows:

23 1. Legislative members of the Advisory Council shall be
24 reimbursed for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance

1 of their duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of
2 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

3 2. Nonlegislative members of the Advisory Council shall be
4 reimbursed by their appointing authorities or respective agencies
5 for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their
6 duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
