1       WHEREAS, March 12, 2013, marked the 101st Anniversary of Girl  
2 Scouts of the USA, founded by Juliette Gordon Low in 1912, in  
3 Savannah, Georgia; and

4       WHEREAS, throughout its distinguished history, Girl Scouting has  
5 inspired millions of girls and women with courage, confidence and  
6 character to make the world a better place; and

7       WHEREAS, through the Girl Scout Leadership Experiences, girls  
8 develop the skills and lessons that will serve them throughout their  
9 lives so that they may contribute to their communities; and

10       WHEREAS, Girl Scouting takes an active role in increasing girls'  
11 awareness of the opportunities in mathematics, science, sports,  
12 technology, and many fields of interest that can expand their  
13 horizons; and

14       WHEREAS, Girl Scouts in Oklahoma is actively addressing the  
15 needs of girls in our state through a leadership program that builds  
16 self-esteem and confidence to address challenges for girls in our  
17 state, including drop-out rates, births to teenagers, obesity, and  
18 poverty; and

19       WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma acknowledges and applauds the  
20 efforts of Girl Scouts in our state, as Girls Scouts celebrate 101  
21 years of providing leadership so that the future women of Oklahoma  
22 will be confident and skilled leaders of tomorrow; and

6 years and advocating on behalf of girls; and

8 members of the honorary Troop 1912 in Oklahoma, including some in  
9 our chamber today.
