16 A Concurrent Resolution declaring April 29, 2014, as
17 "Breast Cancer Awareness Day" in the State of
18 Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

20 WHEREAS, breast cancer is the most common cancer among American
21 women, besides skin cancers, with one in eight women being diagnosed
22 in her lifetime; and

1 WHEREAS, breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer
2 deaths in women, and is projected to claim the lives of nearly
3 40,000 women this year; and

4 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that nearly
5 233,000 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in
6 women in 2014; and

7 WHEREAS, death rates from breast cancer have been declining
8 since 1990 because of earlier detection through screening, increased
9 awareness and improved treatment; and

10 WHEREAS, there are now more than 2.8 million breast cancer
11 survivors in the U.S.; and

12 WHEREAS, breast cancer in men is rare, but it does occur. In
13 2014, it's estimated that nearly 2,400 men will be diagnosed with
14 breast cancer and around 430 will die from the disease. While far
15 less common in men than in women, men still have a 1 in 1,000 chance
16 of getting breast cancer in their lifetime.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION
18 OF THE 54TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
19 CONCURRING THEREIN:

20 THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature declares April 29, 2014, as
21 the 6th Annual "Breast Cancer Awareness Day" in the State of
22 Oklahoma.

24 Executive Director of the IBC Network Foundation, Terry Lynn Arnold;

1 the Professional Firefighters of Oklahoma (PFFO); the Tulsa and
