1 "SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 374 of Title 59, unless there is
3 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 In facilities operated by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans
5 Affairs, the following medication services procedures shall be
6 utilized:

7 1. An inventory record shall be maintained for each Schedule
8 II-V medication distributed to a nursing station such that each dose
9 (unit) is documented;

10 2. For medications which require a prescription, the resident's
11 full name will be affixed to the resident's individual drawer
12 located on the medication cart; and the medication strength, dosage,
13 and directions for use will be located on the medical administration
14 record (MAR);

15 3. For over-the-counter medications that are prescribed, the
16 resident's full name will be affixed to the resident's individual
17 drawer located on the medication cart; and the medication strength,
18 dosage, and directions for use will be located on the medical
19 administration record (MAR);

20 4. When a resident is discharged, or is on therapeutic leave,
21 the unused medication shall be returned to the facility pharmacy as
22 required by United States Department of Veterans Affairs guidelines;

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1 5. Non-controlled medications prescribed for residents who have
2 died and non-controlled medications which have been discontinued
3 shall be returned to the facility pharmacy; and

4 6. Facilities may maintain nonprescription drugs as bulk
5 medications. Bulk medications may include drugs listed in a
6 formulary developed by the facility pharmacist, medical director,
7 and director of nursing. Nonformulary over-the-counter medications
8 may be prescribed if the resident has therapeutic failure, drug
9 allergy, drug interaction or contraindication to the over-the-
10 counter formulary. In addition, bulk dispensing of prescription
11 medications may include controlled and non-controlled medications.
12 Facilities shall establish policies and procedures to assure the
13 safe administration of all medications and full accountability of
14 controlled medications."
