

1 A. The chief executive officer of any agency, board,
2 commission, department or other state governmental entity organized
3 within the executive branch of state government which does not
4 receive appropriations from the Legislature and which is responsible
5 for the licensing of professional persons may receive a salary which
6 is eighty percent (80%) to one hundred percent (100%) of the mean
7 annual wage for the occupation licensed by the entity within the
8 State of Oklahoma as determined by the United States Department of
9 Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics or an appropriate salary as
10 decided by the agency, board, commission, department or other state
11 governmental entity upon approval of the applicable cabinet
12 secretary.

13 B. The provisions of this section shall not be applicable to
14 any agency, board, commission, department or other entity organized
15 within the executive department of state government if such entity
16 receives appropriations from the Legislature.

17 C. Except for the state governmental entities described in
18 subsection A of this section, the Legislature shall prescribe
19 maximum salary amounts for the chief executive officer of any state
20 governmental entity organized within the executive branch of state
21 government each fiscal year in one or more measures as part of the
22 annual appropriations process.

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1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
2 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

3 The Legislature finds that the topic of state employee
4 compensation is or will be made the subject of a remuneration study
5 initiated by the Governor during the fiscal year ending June 30,
6 2013, the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014, or both such fiscal
7 years.

8 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
9 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

10 A. Effective November 1, 2013, each state employee in both the
11 classified and the unclassified service who received a "meets
12 standards" or better rating on his or her performance evaluation
13 shall receive a performance payment of One Thousand Dollars
14 (\$1,000.00) or the amount necessary to equal the difference between
15 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and the amount of any market
16 adjustment received by the employee during the periods of time
17 described by subsection C of this section.

18 B. Of the amount specified in subsection A of this section,
19 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) shall be paid specifically by the
20 employing agency, board, commission, department or other state
21 governmental entity from efficiencies and savings within the budget
22 of the entity for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014.

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1 C. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not be
2 applicable with respect to an employee who has received a market
3 adjustment in compensation of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or
4 more during the fiscal years ending June 30, 2012, June 30, 2013, or
5 for the period of time beginning July 1, 2013, but prior to November
6 1, 2013.

7 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 150.6a A. Effective July 1, 2004, the annual salaries
10 for the Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State
11 Bureau of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in
12 accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule,
13 exclusive of longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this
14 title:

15 1. Deputy Director:

16 The salary of the Deputy Director shall be
17 ninety-five percent (95%) of that received
18 by the Director;

19 2. Division Director:

20 The salary of a Division Director shall be
21 ninety percent (90%) of that received by
22 the Director;

23 3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:

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1 Minimum \$33,500.00, Mid-point \$41,875.00,
2 Maximum \$50,250.00;

3 4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:

4 Minimum \$39,250.00, Mid-point \$49,062.00,
5 Maximum \$58,875.00;

6 5. Agent III (OSBI), Criminalist III:

7 Minimum \$46,250.00, Mid-point \$57,812.00,
8 Maximum \$69,375.00;

9 6. Agent IV (OSBI), Criminalist IV:

10 Minimum \$51,000.00, Mid-point \$63,750.00,
11 Maximum \$76,500.00; and

12 7. Agent V (OSBI), Criminalist V:

13 Minimum \$56,000.00, Mid-point \$70,000.00,
14 Maximum \$84,000.00.

15 B. Effective July 1, 2004, positions allocated to the agent and
16 criminalist job families may receive additional compensation through
17 the use of pay mechanisms provided for in the Oklahoma Personnel Act
18 and the Merit System of Personnel Administration Rules.

19 C. Effective January 1, ~~2007~~ 2013, the annual salaries for the
20 Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau
21 of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance
22 and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of
23 longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

3 The salary of the Deputy Director shall be ninety-five
4 percent (95%) of that received by the Director;

8 ~~4.~~ 3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:

9 Minimum \$40,778.00, Mid-point \$49,153.00,
10 Maximum \$57,528.00;

11 ~~5.~~ 4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:

12 Minimum \$46,260.00, Mid-point \$56,072.00,
13 Maximum \$65,885.00;

14 ~~6.~~ 5. Agent III (OSBI), Criminalist III:

15 Minimum \$51,980.00, Mid-point \$63,542.00,
16 Maximum \$75,105.00;

17 ~~7.~~ 6. Agent IV (OSBI), Criminalist IV:

18 Minimum \$60,615.00, Mid-point \$73,365.00,
19 Maximum \$86,115.00; and

20 ~~8.~~ 7. Agent V (OSBI), Criminalist V:

21 Minimum \$66,386.00, Mid-point \$80,386.00,
22 Maximum \$94,386.00.

1 Provided, however, no such employee shall receive less than the
2 salary the employee received on December 31, 2006.

3 SECTION 5. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as
4 amended by Section 1007, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp.
5 2012, Section 3601.2), is hereby repealed.

6 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

7 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
8 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
9 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
10 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
